Talked with the Sheriff about the floor supports. Sheriff will have Mitch Zurcher research. Mr. Boose thought Mr. Zurcher may want to ask Mike Armstrong to help.

## **Commissioner Boose report**

Senior Service conveyance and option to purchase. Mr. Boose noted that the acreage had changed a little bit and may need adjusted. Mr. Strickler was just waiting on the new numbers to complete the contract.

Norwalk Arts Center lease. This needs to include that they will be holding practices in the building. Mr. Boose also crossed off "gas" under utilities. This unit also heats the Courthouse, so we will not have them pay it.

Circle of Care email from Erie County. They are holding a Stakeholders meeting on Friday, November 8 from 10 to 3.

Estimate from Janotta & Herner for Meeting Room A - \$84,130. Mr. Boose pointed out the estimate was that much for a wide open room. Yet the Board of Elections thinks we can do the rest of the basement, which will require much more work, for \$15,000.

Steve Bischoff email. Once again, he is indicating that the Commissioners are responsible for trucks on County and Township roads. Mr. Boose would like to send a brief email explaining we are not responsible. It is the responsibility of the Sheriff and Engineer's offices, as well as the Townships. Mr. Boose stated they feel it is in the best interest of the County to continue with the current opiate litigation and not to support Attorney General Yost trying to take it over as a state issue.

#### <u>Commissioner Boose report</u> continued

Solid Waste conference call. Mr. Hintz was unable to get through with the numbers provided to him. Mr. Boose said there were only three people in the meeting besides the EPA, so he thought Mr. Hintz wasn't the only one that had problems getting through.

Fiscal year 2021-22 capital budget – CCAO is having a big push to provide money to build or renovate jails. They are proposing state pays 2/3, counties pay 1/3, for a total of 300 million. We won't know if we get money for this until next April or May. He cautioned doing any renovation before knowing if we will have this money available. It sounds very positive.

CCAO also asking for an Ohio Historic Courthouse preservation program. They are looking for money for Courthouse renovation – asking 10 million. This will be based on per capita income.

JFS meeting last week to determine a figure to pay rent for the veteran's portion of the building. Ms. Ziemba thought they had decided on a little over \$20,000 for the year. They used square footage to determine the amount. They had two ways of doing it – one is a fixed amount, which is to pay back the bonds on the building. The other fluctuates and is utilities, maintenance and few other things. They combine the two. We will deduct the veteran's rent from what JFS pays us. However, since we haven't done anything yet this year we will have to catch the year up over the next three months. Ms. Ziemba will start getting the lease together. The last lease expired 2013.

JFS children services. We are expecting their budget to go down by about \$10,000 since the person they hired at Fisher Titus is no longer there. We were hoping it would go down more because the state was giving them more money. However, the increase they are getting out of the state budget is to do extra things, not to pay us for foster care.

#### **Old Business**

Ms. Ziemba asked Mr. Strickler about the BMV lease agreement. He said it was in the queue.

The records room is in progress. Mr. Welch is trying to get the contractors on schedule. Discussion regarding the humidity levels.

No update on the elevator.

Damschroeder will start on the roof next week.

The letter will go out regarding the Board of Elections request.

Sheriff 5-year plan for the jail is still on Mr. Wilde's schedule for September 30. Mr. Hintz asked if the Sheriff received his new cruisers yet. Ms. Ziemba did not think he had because we don't have the titles yet.

Ms. Ziemba has started scheduling budget hearings.

Ms. Ziemba asked if there was an update on the Health Department security system. Mr. Strickler said he had not been able to reach Mr. Gentzel. Mr. Boose had mentioned it to Representative Stein, who told him to contact his office if necessary.

Ms. Ziemba did give the Board of Elections the quotes for their security system. Mr. Kline asked when the work could be started. She told him we needed the okay from them. We also need to know how much money they have available. The sooner we get their approval the sooner we can get Beck Security on the schedule.

Mr. Strickler will make the change to the Norwalk Arts Council lease and he will send it to Ms. Ziemba, who will forward it to the Norwalk Arts Council. She clarified we would begin invoicing them for September utilities.

The letter to South Central went out on September 10. Ms. Ziemba has not heard anything from them.

Still no word on the Engineer's union contract.

Ms. Ziemba brought up the potential Airport Board member they had interviewed. Mr. Boose had thought they were ready to go on this, but found out the current member has not yet resigned, so there is not a seat open.

Two people have picked up the Jail Nursing RFP. Ms. Ziemba asked Ms. Crable to reach out to Willard Mercy, Bellevue and Firelands to let them know it is out there.

Holiday list 2020. Ms. Ziemba will prepare for their approval.

At 10:50 am. Terry Boose moved to adjourn. Joe Hintz seconded the motion. The meeting stood adjourned.
