Mrs. Ziemba asked if all commissioners would be attending the Norwalk Middle School Breakfast of Champions on May 17th and May 18th. The Board agreed to attend both days.

Commissioner Hintz and Wilde will be attending the Child Abuse Breakfast on April 26th Commissioner Boose is undecided due to schedule conflict.

At 9:40 a.m. Melissa James came into the meeting. Mr. Boose asked about the F-permit at the Fair Grounds on July 4, 2017. Mr. Boose asked does this have to go through the fair board, Ms. Ziemba stated they need to fill out the F – permit and it can be printed off. The F-permit needs to go to the fair board and

then needs to come to the Commissioners.

Ms. James asked if the Commissioners has seen the full page ads from Mr. Bader, the Board stated they had not seen them. Ms. James wanted to thank the Board for their help in moving this into the right direction and get the information needed.

Ms. James explained that students from Western Reserve asked if they could attend a business visit in Huron County. Carol Knapp and Ms. James will be on these tours. Ms. James spoke in regards to the charter school in Norwalk.

DISCUSSION OF MEETINGS ATTENDED THE PREVIOUS WEEK

Mr. Wilde reported on the 911 meeting. Mr. Wilde stated they really wanted a 911 coordinator. Mr. Boose asked who wants it. Mr. Wilde stated it was Jason Roblin. Mr. Roblin is concerned he does not have the knowledge to head this up. Mr. Boose stated that he thinks the 911 board needs to meet to discussed this coordinator issue. Mr. Boose asked if there were any elected officials there that stepped up and stated they would give any money towards this, Mr. Wilde stated no. Mr. Wilde stated the North Central EMS was there and they only have one line coming in, 911 committee voted to give them a 2nd line in the amount of \$8,000.00. Mr. Boose stated it is his opinion that this group is not the people who should be making the decision regarding a 911 coordinator. Mr. Boose stated that is like asking the Sheriff if he needs more money for the jail, for which he will always say yes. Mr. Boose stated what we need are the people who make the monetary decisions to make that decision. Mr. Wilde asked who is that, Mr. Boose stated that the 911 committee has power to decide how the 911 account money is spent, and any extra money that is needed would come from the Commissioners or any other department willing to contribute. Mr. Boose stated that as a County Commissioner he will not vote to put money into the account unless everyone else in county gets an equal share.

At 10:00 a.m. 2017 CHIP 2nd Public Hearing – Don Corley, WSOS, presenting the information.

Mr. Corley stated that they were holding a 2nd Public Hearing for a pending grant application that the Commissioners will be filing with the State of Ohio under the Community Housing Program 2017 (CHIP Grant). There are two partnering jurisdictions, City of Norwalk (partner on the current CHIP grant) and the City of Willard. This is the first year that Willard has been eligible to participate. Mr. Corley explained they conducted the 1st Public Hearing on February 28, 2017, where they can determine if they have activity that would fall under the CDBG grant, the CHIP program involves CDBG funding and home funds, this funding will include Community Development Block Grant and HOME funds from HUD, as well as Ohio Housing Trust Funds. The partnership will make the application more competitive and qualify the partners to request additional funding.

An initial public hearing was held on February 28, 2017, the purpose of this hearing was to present citizens with information about the county's intended request for housing funds.

The county will request funds for the following activities:

HOME Funds: Private Owner Rehabilitation - \$625,500/15 unites; New Construction with Habitat for Humanity - \$22,000/1unit; Tenant Rent Assistance - \$48,500/10 units; Administration - \$65,000.00.

CDBG Funds: Home Repair - \$269,800/24 owners; \$35,200/5 rental units; Administration & Fair Housing \$79,000.00.

Ohio Housing Trust Fund: Owner Home Repair \$55,000/5 units.

The partners will also commit program income funds for related activities.

The program operating area would be all of Huron County and the Cities of Norwalk and Willard. The operating period if funded is a competitive process beginning September 1, 2017 activities will run through October 1, 2019. Mr. Boose asked if it was a two-year program. Mr. Corley it is technically 26 months but they have to do some environmental review processes up front, therefore it will be January 2018 before they can put the money on the streets so to speak.

Mr. Corley explained the Primary Housing activities:

Private Owner-occupied rehabilitation: The County will request funding of \$625,000 in HOME funds for a minimum of 15 units. Six units would be targeted to county residents, 5 to Norwalk residents, and 4 to Willard residents. All rehab will meet Ohio Residential Rehab Standards & HUD standards for lead based paint in existing dwellings. Funds would be provided as combination deferred and forgivable loans, secured with a mortgage and promissory note. Owner-occupants with incomes below 80% of median

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income are eligible. Applications are ranked on a priority scale with the highest scoring applicants considered first.

Home Repair: The County will request funding of \$324,800 for owner-occupied home repairs for a minimum of 29 units. Twelve units would be targeted to county residents, nine to Norwalk and eight to Willard residents. Home Repair typically address one system – repairing or replacing unsafe/substandard conditions. Assistance would be provided as a grant to the eligible homeowner. The request will include \$269,800 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and \$55,000 Ohio Housing Funds (OHTF). CDBG funds are available for owner-occupants with incomes below 80% of area median. OHTF are restricted to owner households with incomes below 50% of area median.

Tenant-Based Rental Assistance: The County will request \$48,500 of HOME funds for Tenant-Based Rental Assistance for a minimum of 10 households. Two units would be targeted to county residents, 4 for Norwalk residents, and 4 to Willard residents. Participating renters pay 30% of their monthly income on rent/utilities and CHIP funds provide the balance of rent to the cooperating landlord. Huron Metropolitan Housing Authority will implement the activity.

Rental Home Repairs: The County will request \$35,200 of CDBG funds for Rental Home Repairs, to be used for five (5) units (3 in Norwalk and 2 in Willard) rented to low income tenants. Participating owners will provide 50% matching funds for the construction costs. Assistance would be provided as a two-year forgivable loan to the property owner, with an agreement to rent and occupancy limitations for two years. Mr. Boose asked they are allowed to rent to only someone who is eligible for this grant. Mr. Corley stated that is the obligation they sign when they sign up for this grant. If they cannot adhere to the obligations, the owner will have to pay the grant back in full.

The County will request \$22,000 of HOME funds for new construction in cooperation with Habitat for Humanity. Habitat will bring additional resources and identify the CHIP eligible buyer for one home to be built in the City of Norwalk. The county will utilize program income funds to target 1 additional Habitat home to be built during the CHIP program operating period.

The balance of funds would be used for project administration (\$144,000.00 combined HOME & CDBG). Funds are included in this total to provide CHIP related Fair Housing activities. The Huron County Commissioners will share administration duties with WSOS who will implement the project. The application is due to ODSA Office of Community Development by May 5, 2017.

They will be going door to door soon. Two reminders are sent to owners who have not purchased their dog licenses. Mr. Ousley stated that the two new employees are great. Mr. Boose how often do they do a dog health check, Mr. Ousley stated it happens when someone is bitten by the dog or if the dog is injured. Mr. Hintz asked Mr. Ousley to discuss the possibility of increasing the dog tag fee, Mr. Ousley stated that Erie County is at \$20.00, we raised it from \$12.00 to \$16.00, if they raise the fee, it must be done by July 2017. Mr. Boose stated that if it needs raised he has no problem with that.

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Mr. Hintz discussed the possible get Mary Beth Taylor a vehicle for God's Little Critters. Mr. Strickler stated the issue will be in titling the vehicle, depending how they obtain the vehicle. The vehicle must use as a public purpose, and under \$2,500.00.

DISCUSSION OF MEETINGS ATTENDED THE PREVIOUS WEEK cont.

Mr. Boose suggested we moved back to the topic of the 911 meeting. Would like a letter sent to Jason Roblin that states if he believes there is a need for a 911 coordinator then requests him to come up with a way to fund it. Mr. Hintz stated that Mr. Roblin said he is not qualified to do the 911 coordinator's job. Mr. Boose stated there is money available they are giving to different departments, the group that Mr. Wilde was with consist of fire chiefs, and he stated they need to ask this group how are you to fund this.

Mr. Wilde discussed when the 911 system went down, the reasons were, and somehow everything the program is in Colorado, they were doing an update for us. They were doing a new 911 here same company, our system needed to reboot ours instead of rebooting the program in Colorado. Procedure now is the same person will not work on both systems at the same time.

Mr. Boose stated there are some people who thought that the amount of time to get the notice out that the 911 system was down took too long. Mr. Wilde stated he doesn't know the amount of time from when it went down and when the notice went out, but a policy has been implemented so this will not happen again.

Mr. Boose stated that if they discuss the 911 coordinator a plan on how this is going to be funded needs to be established and if it comes back that the Commissioners will have to fund it, Mr. Boose will not agree to this. Mr. Wilde stated that all the dispatcher training is completed, Mr. Boose asked if this was the training that was taking place in Willard, Mr. Wilde stated that is correct.

Mr. Boose suggested to Mr. Hintz to set up the small meeting to discuss what the money can be used for. And have a plan for it.

Mr. Boose stated he received an email from the Auditor about the data process board meeting regarding Mr. Boose being the chairman of the board and that he needed to set up a meeting. The ORC says the Auditor is the secretary of the data process board and needs to set the meeting within five days of receiving a request.

At 11:15 a.m. the board recessed.

<u>At 11:22 a.m.</u> the board resumed regular session with continued discussion of meetings attended the previous week.

Commissioner Boose reported on the Community Corrections Board meeting he attended. He learned more about NO-BARS. Mr. Boose is concerned because it's a grant. The Judge would like to see it as a permanent program for which they discussed the recovery program in Lorain County. Reported he believes Beth Williams is coming around to the idea of recovery housing. She hasn't expressed committing funds. Mr. Boose stated that Family Life Counseling indicated that Ms. Williams was strongly for recovery.

Chief Light indicated there has been no contract signed between Board of DD and Firelands Recovery for next year. Mr. Boose stated when they spoke to Ms. Williams she indicated that the money was all tied up for this.

There are issues regarding sharing information on drug issues and family issues between JFS and police departments. Mr. Boose stated that they may need to sit down and talk to the chief because they issue was brought regarding information not being shared, so JFS sent to law enforcements in Huron County some kind of agreement and memorandum of understanding, of which the law enforcement stated they will not sign this. Mr. Sitterly stated that the MOU needs to read differently. It is his belief that the law enforcement. Mr. Sitterly stated that the State of Chio held a confidential training session for all DJFS. Mr. Boose asked if the commissioners need to discuss this with Jill Eversole-Nolan and possible someone from police department. The board agreed to hold this. Mr. Sitterly suggested more of the department from DJFS be at the meeting.

REGULAR SESSION OTHER BUSINESS

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The board discussed the following meetings/receptions coming up on the calendar May 4th @ 5:30 VIP reception @ Croghan Bank. – Mr. Boose will RSVP for this event. SIGNINGS

Mr. Strickler stated it is ok to sign the Airport board documents.

Mr. Boose stated that he is done spending money at the airport, and he doesn't care whose money it is. Mr. Hintz stated he was told by the FAA that either you go with this or we will not give you egress for Summit Raceway, this is not right this is black mail. Mr. Boose stated there is a time when they will need to sit down with Bill Bader and say, it's ironic that we continue to spend money on the airport so he can egress, but you have problems with the airport and the ODOT Air and FAA, we are just going around in circles. Mr. Boose stated they could stop funding the airport and not have the problems anymore, however we are funding the airport so Summit could have egress. It doesn't make sense to continue to sign grants so he can continue to have egress, when the airport is his only issue. Mr. Hintz stated that is not it they are a federally obligated airport. Mr. Boose stated nothing is being done to get out from under this. Mr. Hintz states this is very, very difficult to get out from under thumb. Mr. Boose states they need an action plan for the airport.

Mr. Boose stated he would like to see a letter stating that the FAA is stating the Commissioners need to sign this grant or they will be held liable. Mr. Boose stated an action plan for the airport is needed.

OTHER BUSINESS cont.

Mr. Boose stated they need to continue to look at the statehouse report and will be voting on the budget next week. Mr. Boose stated this will also include the Opiates epidemic along with the Medicaid tax.

Ms. Ziemba questioned if the Commissioners would like to see the DJFS request for over \$1,000.00, Mr. Boose stated that they have not approved them before. Mr. Boose wants clarification on how to handle this. Mr. Boose suggests telling them yes continue to send us the requests over \$1,000 and if they find there to be a lot they can change the policy.

Mr. Boose would like to request for the auditor's office regarding the sales tax that it is sent to the commissioners before it is sent to the paper, so they can read it before the public does.

At 12:21 p.m. Terry Boose moved to adjourn. Bruce Wilde seconded the motion. The meeting stood adjourned.
