Discussed various meetings and the need to have budget work sessions. Will plan for an all-day budget session on Thursday March 16, 2017.

At 10:15 a.m. the board recessed.

<u>At 10:30 a.m.</u> the board resumed regular session with Sheriff Corbin, Tammy Shaffer, Shawn Newton, Tod Wagner, and Charles Summers for budget discussion.

Sheriff Corbin discussed the jail budget, it includes the salaries along with the 2.5% raise. Sheriff Corbin is hoping to see the overtime budget stay the same, they are going to 12 hr. shifts. Nurse's salary will not change because this is contracted out through Fisher-Titus Hospital. Sheriff Corbin doesn't see anything change in regards to inmate food. Sheriff Corbin explained that he needs to replace some equipment at the jail. Sheriff Corbin explained that they put \$40,000 in contractual for any unforeseen issues that may happen.

Mr. Boose stated he wanted to point out the estimated amount of money coming from the sales tax (1/2%) for the jail is \$2,783,333.00, and the total amount from jail is \$2,953,628.00 General Fund will have to subsidized almost \$ 200,000.00, Mr. Boose stated they were hoping to not have to put General Fund money into the jail side of the budget. Sheriff Corbin stated that it is hard to generalize the funds coming in from other counties for inmates that are housed in Huron County. The cost is \$58.00 a day to house these inmates. Sheriff Corbin stated this is totally up to the judges if these inmates need to be housed.

Sheriff Corbin stated they currently have 11 road deputies, he is asking for 5 additional. They have done more drug cases in the last two months than what was done last year, currently 2 deputies split between detective and road. Sheriff Corbin stated he now has 6 dispatches which is the state minimum. Sheriff Corbin is trying to take advantage of the free schools and online training.

Mr. Boose discussed the radios, EMA has the money that could fund the sheriff's office. If the money was taken from EMA it would fund dispatch at a cost of \$65,000 for radios and \$30,000 for counters with ABCO training at \$10,000.

Sheriff Corbin explained he received a letter regarding Erie County sheriff decommission a van. There will be no money from the Commissioners, this will be free to the county. This will be used to haul inmates from the jail. Mr. Boose explained that he spoke to Chief Light regarding some issues and 9-1-1. Chief Light thought that Erie County may have a part-time IT person, he will speak to them to see how that works.

At 11:21 a.m. the board recessed. At 11:40 a.m. the board resumed regular session.

Mr. Strickler stated he thought the FOJ for sheriff may not be correct. The board will ask Mr. Tkach to verify the allowance for FOJ.

Mr. Boose stated he has a meeting March 20th at Vern Riffe State Office Tower at 1:00 p.m. with other representatives from surrounding counties to talk about possible collaboration. Steve Arndt put together the meeting.

<u>At 1:00 p.m.</u> the board resumed regular session with Judge Conway and Linda Stower. Judge Conway discussed raises, submitted budget for 2% and 3%. When the budget is healthy would like the board to look at taking care of the employees. Judge Conway stated he had an employee die and will replace her. He had a payout of vacation and sick but believes the budget will still even out. Judge Conway would like the floor fixed in the courthouse, they had a leak on the roof that has done some damage and maintenance is aware of it. Some repairs have been done but not all. The plaster is bubbling and coming off and need to check the law library to make sure there is no damage there.

Judge Conway discussed the 5th degree felony, moving forward the State of Ohio is looking for the court to be a rehabilitation forum. It has been discussed that the State of Ohio will provide funding for this, counseling, probation staff, treatment programs and supervision. Judge Conway believes it will be a longtime funding. This cannot be on a grant basis. Mr. Boose stated they are in very early discussion with Erie and Ottawa County on these types of projects.

Judge Conway stated NOBARS program is up in June, and Judge Conway doesn't know if there will be funding. Judge Conway would like to get an extensive drug program with employability and transportation. Judge Conway is looking at being a certified Drug court through the Supreme Court.

Mr. Boose stated they will do a uniform salary increase in the line item, but up to the department. Judge Conway stated that ¹/₄ of magistrate's salary comes from special projects funds and mediation is working out nicely and saves the county money on court fees. Ms. Stower stated there is now jurors commission employees line, use to be outside people and has changed to now be employees.

Discussion was had on how to proceed with the budget and instructions to Ms. Ziemba what to prepare for the next meeting. Ms. Ziemba will prepare what she believes they are asking for. Ms. Ziemba asked if she is to include the raises because they have submitted both ways. The board discussed how they would like this to be done for the budget work session on Thursday, March 16, 2017. Mr. Wilde explained they would like Ms. Ziemba to take the interim without the extras, add 2% to the salary line item.

Mr. Boose wanted to discuss what the salary is for the assistant for Human Resources, the board stated no they have not. Mr. Boose would like to speak about the special accounts. Mr. Boose asked if Ms. Ziemba used the cut budget sent by Buildings and Grounds, Ms. Ziemba stated no, because they always end up putting more money into that budget at the end of the year. Mr. Boose suggested that Mr. Wilde go to Mr. Tkach and asked why there are two different numbers. Ms. Ziemba is to contact the Sheriff and find out

how they came up the number for the salary line item.

Mr. Boose states that if it comes down to the end and they want to give 2% raises but they are short let's say \$100,000, and going to Mr. Tkach asking for more money.

Mr. Hintz stated what isn't to say we could change that amount that is being asked for from the Auditor to cover these projected expensive. Mr. Boose stated that you can, however you don't want to ask for all of it, it lessens your carryover. Mr. Boose explained the goal is to go to the state government, that is why there is a meeting on March 20, 2017 and another meeting with the cabinet when the governor comes in on April 2, 2017 to ask for money. Then they will go to the federal government and ask about the money coming from the federal government, it's sizable around a quarter billion dollars into Ohio. Discussion is already going on in Portman's Office.

Mr. Wilde asked if there is anything new about the lights at the raceway, Mr. Hintz stated not at this time. Mr. Wilde stated he spoke to Gail Manning and Mr. Boose talked to Dick Stein regarding this. Mr. Wilde asked if anyone spoke to Melissa at the airport, at this time none of the Commissioners have. Mr. Hintz stated he will call Harry and Melissa and talk to them. Mr. Boose stated that Mr. Stein is going to the Lt. Governor, he's made contact to set up a meeting with ODOT. Mr. Stein wants to discuss this issue alone with ODOT. Mr. Wilde spoke to Ms. Manning and she is currently trying to get in touch with some people, there were no definite specifics because she hasn't spoken to anyone.

<u>At 3:30 p.m.</u> Terry Boose moved to adjourn. Bruce Wilde seconded the motion. The meeting stood adjourned.
