As usual, the interest is going nowhere. STAR Ohio is at 0.12%, up from 0.07% at the April meeting. The Treasurer reported that Home Savings & Loan can now work with public funds, so a money market account of \$1,000,000.00 has been opened at the Norwalk branch.

The Treasurer told the Board that Tax Ease purchased \$121,000.00 in delinquency at the May sale, and to date with the tax lien sales and payment contracts, the delinquency has been cut in half. The next meeting will be October 13, 2015, at 11:00 a.m.

Seeing no other business to come before the Board, Commissioner Dunlap made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Hintz.

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agreement that Carol Knapp can move down in front of Board of Elections.

Ms. Nolan stated that the Commissioners received an email from Doug Foust regarding CEBCO rates dropping 11% from the original rates received a couple of weeks ago.
