## REGULAR SESSION TUESDAY SEPTEMBER 29, 2015

The Board of Huron County Commissioners met this date in Regular Session. Roll being called found the following members present: Gary W. Bauer, Tom Dunlap, Joe Hintz.

Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 305.14 the Record of the Proceedings of the September 24, 2015 meeting(s) were presented to the Board. Gary W. Bauer made the motion to waive the reading of the minutes of the September 24, 2015 meeting(s) and approve as presented. Joe Hintz seconded the motion. Voting was as follows:

At 9:30 a.m. Chad Stang, Soil and Water Conservation District, Director came before the board to present his report. Mr. Stang explained that some of the big things they like to do is education. They will be reaching out to the farmers in on outreach educational classes, which include 2<sup>nd</sup> grade Harbor Day, 4<sup>th</sup> grade field day, Huron County Fair, Planning Meeting and Tour, soil judging, Envirothon and Fall Fun Fest. Mr. Stang explained on Harbor Day, they take pine trees out to all 2<sup>nd</sup> graders and hold a poster contest. 4<sup>th</sup> grade field day is held at the Huron County Fair Grounds with many activities.

Mr. Stang explained that the Huron County Fair is where he would like to expanded the activities. They would like to have a t.v. and iPod to watch an FAA group present a video on conservation technique, this where he would like to find grant funding. Mr. Stang explained that the Planning Meeting and tour this year was held at Sunrise. It was very productive meeting. Mr. Hintz and Mr. Bauer attended along with State Representative Terry Boose and Congressman Gibbs Aid Darrell Kick.

Mr. Stang explained that they just currently applied for the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Grant – Huron and Vermilion Rivers, 9 priority watershed (closed fall 2014). Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Grant – Old Woman Creek watershed. Currently working with Erie County and Winrock International to test out this innovative grant technique. The application was submitted on September 25, 2015.

Mr. Stang explained looking ahead to 2016. The Agronomy building will have a new look. They will be applying for the Huron River Watershed Grant (details have not been finalized). This has been about 7 years since they have had a grant for Huron River. Mr. Stang explained they may be taking on Migrant Camp from Erie Basin RC&D. Also, they will be under Ohio Department of Agriculture instead of Ohio Department of Natural Resources, they should see very little operational impact.

At 9:56 a.m. Marques Binette, Assistant Prosecutor came before the board to explain the Prosecutor's office. Mr. Binette explained what he does at the Huron County Prosecutor's Office. Mr. Binette handed out a pamphlet from the Ohio Bar Association regarding when you turn 18. When you turn 18 in Ohio, the state recognizes that you have all the rights and responsibilities of an adult, except with regard to the "drinking" law.

Mr. Binette explained that when you turn 18, you have the legal right to rent an apartment, just keep in mind that if you break a lease the landlord can sue you. You can sign into contract, legally you are the person responsible. Do not sign a contract until you understand what you are getting into. Credit Cards and loans will be on your own, without having a co-signer. Accidents are now your responsibility, they will not go after mom and dad, and you are now responsible. Mr. Binette explained that jury duty, you may be asked to serve on a jury. When you turn 18, you may get married without your parents' consent. All medical treatment can now be consented by you, including surgery. You may vote when you turn 18. Mr. Binette explained for men only, must register with the selective services it is the law, if you don't register it could cost you in penalties.

**WHEREAS,** State Issue One establishes the bipartisan Ohio Redistricting Commission, composed of 7 members including the Governor, the Auditor of State, the Secretary of State, and 4 members appointed by the majority and minority leaders of the General Assembly;

**WHEREAS,** State Issue One requires a bipartisan majority vote of 4 members in order to adopt any final district plan, and prevents deadlock by limiting the length of time any plan adopted without bipartisan support is effective;

now therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners of Huron County Ohio, support State Issue One which creates a bipartisan, public process for drawing legislative districts; and further

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the foregoing resolution was adopted and all actions and deliberations of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Huron, Ohio, relating thereto were conducted in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**WHEREAS,** State Issue Two ensures that our Constitution is used as intended by its framers for matters that benefit the broad public interest; and

**WHEREAS,** State Issue Two ensures that our Constitution cannot be abused and corrupted by those interested in obtaining exclusive deals and special commercial benefits; and

**WHEREAS,** State Issue Two upholds our State's traditional spirit and traditional meaning of free commerce, fair trade and fair dealing; now therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners of Huron County Ohio, supports State Issue Two which protects our Constitution from monopoly interests; and further

**WHEREAS**; State Issue Three puts our children at risk by legalizing marijuana-infused products like candy and cookies, which often have dangerously high levels of THC, and are highly tempting to children, including very young children;

and

**WHEREAS,** State Issue Three establishes high limits on personal possession of marijuana which will expose children and underage high school and college students to marijuana; and

**WHEREAS,** State Issue Three proposes to flood Ohio with marijuana, allowing 1159 retail marijuana stores and allowing every adult to possess more than half a pound of marijuana, in addition to possessing four flowering marijuana plants at home; and

**WHEREAS,** State Issue Three poses severe public safety and workforce competitiveness concerns and will burden social service and drug treatment programs;

now therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners of Huron County Ohio, opposes State Issue Three which grants a monopoly for the commercial production and sale of marijuana for recreational and medicinal purposes and further

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the foregoing resolution was adopted and all actions and deliberations of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Huron, Ohio, relating thereto were conducted in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
