**IN THE MATTER OF SETTING HEARING FOR AMENDING REGULATIONS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM**

Larry J. Silcox moved the adoption of the following resolution:

**WHEREAS**, the County Floodplain Coordinator has been informed that an amendment to Section 6.3 of the existing Huron County Special Purpose Flood Damage Regulations is required in order to bring the regulations into compliance with ODNR standards; and

**WHEREAS**, without this amendment the current regulations would be out of compliance and the residents of Huron County unincorporated areas would not be able to purchase flood insurance coverage for their properties; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of the Board of Huron County Commissioners to hold a public hearing Tuesday, February 21, 2012 at 10:30 a.m. and Tuesday, February 28, 2012 at 10:30 a.m. in the office of the Huron County Commissioners, 180 Milan Avenue, Norwalk, Ohio 44857 to provide citizens an opportunity to review and comment on the county's amendment to Section 6.3 of the existing Huron County Special Purpose Flood Damage Regulations; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 6.3 of the existing Huron County Special Purpose Flood Damage Regulations needs to be amended to read, Violation of the provisions of these regulations, or failure to comply with any of its requirements or lawful orders issued pursuant thereto, shall be deemed to be a strict liability offense. Any person who violates these regulations, or fails to comply with any of its requirements or lawful orders issued pursuant thereto, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than \$300.00 and, in addition, shall pay all costs and expenses involved in the case as provided by the laws of Huron County. Each day such violation continues shall be considered a separate offense. Nothing herein contained shall prevent Huron County from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation. Huron County shall prosecute any violation of these regulations in accordance with the penalties stated herein. now therefore
