Administrator/Clerk's Report

Cheryl Nolan mentioned a parade form that was received in the office in regards to the Willard parade and also the Firemen's Festival parade in Wakeman. The board agreed that they would not register as a group this year but would register individually on their own. Ms. Nolan will not send in registration forms this year. Ms. Nolan also presented the vehicle maintenance agreement for discussion in regards to the utilization charge as to whether it needs to be in the agreement or not. The board agreed that this statement stay in the agreement.

At 9-30 a.m. Public Comment

Fred Eldridge asked if there was a funding amount set aside for the handicap ramp at 180 Milan Avenue, Administration Building. Mr. Bauer stated that at this time we have the architect's estimate but we need to firm that number and will have a public hearing to name the projects for the FY-12 grant.

At 9:39 a.m. Pete Welch came before the board in regards to the air-conditioning at BMV. The air unit went down on Friday and it is thirteen years old. Tim Bettac received a quote and if we replace the condenser on the motor it will be about \$800.00. Mr. Hintz asked if this is something that Mr. Bettac can do in house. Mr. Welch answered yes and after it is ordered we are looking at next week before the air is working. If you would decide to replace the whole unit it would cost about \$1,400.00. Mr. Silcox asked what Mr. Bettac's recommendation is. Mr. Welch stated that with the possibility of them moving out of there they should do this temporary fix at this time. The board agreed and gave a verbal approval. Mr. Welch also spoke in regards to the lawnmower that he trades in every year at the landfill. This past time we went two years and stated that he would like to spend \$2,000 with Shearer as they have the Deere national contract and they will trade the existing one that is out there and for \$2,000 we can get a new one. Mr. Silcox asked how much he mows with this tractor. Mr. Welch stated a lot. Further discussion was had in regards to the size of the mower, what it is worth etc. Mr. Welch stated that the trade in value for the existing mower is \$3,225.99. Mr. Silcox asked Mr. Welch to call an airport authority board member to see if they are interested in purchasing this mower. Mr. Bauer stated that he had time on Friday to work on the Courthouse landscaping. Mr. Silcox is helping with this project as well along with Darwin Pesnell is to learn how to do this work. Mr. Welch stated that he is going to see Dan Frederick this morning.

Gary Bauer discussed the funds for Moving Ohio Forward Grant program. Kathleen Schaffer presented the information on such grant. Ms. Schaffer will have to bill the State Auditor's office for funds. Ms. Schaffer does not want to do the bidding process and she needs someone to do this and has contacted Ellen Heinz and Mr. Bauer stated that he would not approve that and Roland Tkach stated that he was absolutely right on this. Mr. Bauer stated that he talked with Kathy Phillips and Mike Gastier, OSU Extension as Carol Knapp was not available. Mr. Bauer stated that he wants to see Huron County Economic Development handle this. Mr. Bauer also called Gary Mortus in this regard as well and he is working on putting this together. Erie County is working through their land bank and some are working with their CICs. The board agreed that this should be done by Huron County Development Council. Mr. Silcox referred to the fact that Norwalk city had spoken with him about this funding as well. Mr. Bauer stated that the county will handle this and that the city of Norwalk will not take over the handling of this funding.

Mr. Bauer also stated that they closed state route 18 on Saturday. Mr. Bauer stated that he finds it interesting that the closing was done by Norwalk city according to ODOT as opposed to the county or the highway department or the sheriff. ODOT closed it and notified Josh Schneider and Mr. Schneider forwarded the closing notice to Carl Essex who then forwarded it to the board.

At 10:00 a.m. Joyce Huntley came before the board along with Terry Jacobs and Ruthanne House and Nadine Thompson, WSOS to present weatherization program report. Mr. Jacobs stated that the weatherization program from the department of energy has been zeroed out in Ohio along with 22 other states. This means that last year they did 53 homes in Huron County which is a big number and now we will be down to about 6 per month. The funding has been drastically reduced and utilities are providing a lot of these funds. The state of Ohio is trying to keep this program going. Mr. Jacob explained what they are currently working on which is a multifamily unit and this is being done with Ohio Edison funds which is called "Sir Frederick". This is an energy saving program. Ms. House stated that the utility funding does remain strong.

Discussion was had in regards to the Moving Ohio Forward Grant Program. Ms. House stated that WSOS is going to send an email to all the communities and ask if they would like to attend a meeting to try and do a consortium kind of application as we did with the NSP grant. Mr. Bauer asked what percent the charge would be for WSOS to administer this grant. Ms. House stated that at this time the AG has put a limit of 5% for administrative costs and further stated that they have had some discussions to try to define what they are including in admin costs as we have rehab specialists and they are the people that are out in the fields bidding the jobs, walking through with the contractors, getting the bid specs ready, getting it out to bid, doing the bids etc. The average cost under neighbor stabilization program could be between \$10,000 to \$13,000 per demo. So if there is a 5% on this administration cost we can not do it for 5% so they have had conversations with the AG's office and what they have told them is that they are willing to consider a higher admin fee because they realize the 5% may have been too low. Ms. House further stated that they will probably be somewhere in the neighbor of 10%. Mr. Silcox stated that this is good to know as they make their decision. The meeting will be in Fremont at WOSO office on Wednesday May 30, 2012 9:00 a.m.

Discussion was also had in regards to the CDBG FY-12 grant funding.

At 10:22 a.m. the board recessed

At 10:37 a.m. regular session was resumed. Karen Fries, came before the board to present a report for the records retention. Ms. Fries stated that this is the annual report for records retention to keep you up to date as to what is going on and further stated that in the last year they have been trying to make sure that every office has a retention policy. Further discussion was had in regards to what offices need to be part of the county retention policy. Daivia Kasper, Assistant Prosecutor stated that the fair board in not a county office nor is the Humane Society so they would not fall under the county retention policy. Soil & Water Conservation District does come under the county policy. Ms. Fries stated that the majority of the county offices have policies and we just need to check with a few others. Ms. Fries also discussed records that are being stored at HCOB basement that were brought back from Bowling Green and we need to notify the different offices that these records belong to so that they can look at them and see what they want and what they do not want. Mr. Silcox asked Ms. Fries to send them a letter and she stated that she has not done so yet but will do so. Mr. Silcox stated that she should give them a deadline as to what they want to do with these records by July 1, 2012 which gives them 30 days to go through the records and further stated that if we don't do that they will sit there forever. Ms. Fries also discussed the forms to use for discarding records. The only time that we can use the RC-1 is if it is an old record that has been lying around and there have been no new such records created. This is a one time disposal form. The records commission board also needs to have a policy in place as well. Mr. Bauer asked Ms. Fries to explain about the additional charges at Iron Mountain where the microfilm records are stored. Ms. Fries stated a notice for the bill for the year showed an increase of \$1,254.00 more this year and after receiving this made some calls and she just heard last week that they do not know how it happened but they have not increased their charges and are going to send a new bill to show the \$1,254.00 taken off the bill.

At 11:00 a.m. Eva Gorby, Victims Assistance came before the board in regards to presenting an overview of the projected VOCA & JAG grant applications. Ms. Gorby referred to the second page which is a letter from Mike DeWine's office stating that we have received a 12% cut from the VOCA funds. The numbers presented represent the 12% cut which is two full time employees and one part time employee staying at 40 hours and 24 hours. Mr. Bauer asked when the deadline was. Ms. Gorby stated that the JAG grant deadline is May 31, 2012 and the VOCA grant deadline is June 29, 2012. Mr. Bauer stated that this is a good program.

Budget

Larry J. Silcox moved to approve the VOCA and Byrne(JAG) grants for 2012-2013 in the amounts of \$36,744.33 for the VOCA grant and \$9,119.82 BYRNE (JAG) grant for a total match of \$45,864.15. Joe Hintz seconded the motion. The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

Assistant Prosecutor's Report

Mr. Bauer referred to an email received from Sue Bommer, HR in regards to information that she had received from the Auditor's office as follows:

The auditor's office has informed me that, after paying this week's claims, the health insurance trust stands at a balance of \$33,000. We also are expecting to be billed today for our administrative fees (\$40,000 - \$45,000). If we do get the admin bill today, Dennis will deposit our employee and employer contributions a week early (\$390,000 - \$395,000). However, as more claims come in, we anticipate the fund balance being lower this month than it was at the end of last month, even though our contribution rates are higher. One especially high claim should top out at stop loss soon and that will help, but our claims have been running especially high this year and it may well be that this month's stop-gap measure will only prolong activating a Plan B.

Mr. Bauer stated that he would like to discuss this problem with Daivia Kasper, Assistant Prosecutor in regards to the Health Trust Fund and further stated that the Auditor requested that he discuss this problem with her. Mr. Bauer stated that we are running on very little carryover from month to month in the health insurance fund and right now we have \$29,754.50 and we will have another bill coming in next week and we also having a payment coming in next week so it will probably be ok this month. We also hope that with the additional funds that should be coming in because of the changes made in the health insurance policies we would hope that we would work our way out of this, however the question here is can we borrow to keep this fund a float. Ms. Kasper asked if they were to borrow money how long. Mr. Bauer stated that we are hoping for a short period and would do it month to month. Mr. Bauer stated that there is reason to believe that one piece of this that has been costing quite a lot will cease now. Mr. Bauer stated that he feels that Mr. Tkach is looking at borrowing from another fund. Ms. Kasper stated that is not what he talked to her about and she thinks he is talking about the county borrowing from a financial institution. Mr. Silcox stated that he did not like that idea, and Mr. Bauer agreed that he did not either. Ms. Kasper stated that if it was going to be borrowed from another fund it would just be a simple transfer of funds from either the contingencies fund or miscellaneous. Mr. Tkach was throwing around significant amount. Mr. Silcox stated that there is another source out there that we have not even considered which is all the special funds that are out there. Mr. Silcox stated that it is his understanding that there is a process to get those funds in an emergency situation and rather than go out and borrow money this may be the situation where we have to go after some of those special funds. Mr. Silcox stated that he looked the other day and one of them had \$422,000.00. Mr. Bauer stated you mean other than the budget commission. Mr. Silcox stated yes and if you look at the sheet that we get the first of the month there is a ton of unencumbered funds in those special funds. Mr. Silcox stated that there is a process which is a lengthy and involved process to get those funds to use them in a fiscal emergency. Mr. Silcox stated that there is too much money sitting out there and this is where he would look. Ms. Kasper stated that you want to know whether or not the county commissioners can take control of the special funds and move it over to pay the health trust. Mr. Silcox stated that it is his understanding that there is a procedure to do that and it is involved but there is such a procedure and he needs to know if that is correct and what that procedure is. Ms. Kasper asked what are the special funds because a lot of the special funds fall under different revised code sections. Mr. Silcox stated that he is not talking about the levied special funds but is talking about ones like the courts computerization fund, clerk of courts computerization fund, the license bureau fund, equipment funds some of those funds out there and it was his understanding that there is a procedure to get those funds when money is tight and this is where he would like to see these funds come from because the last time he totaled up all special funds it was over 4 million dollars. He knows this is not going to make people happy but he is not in favor of borrowing money to cover health insurance. Mr. Hintz stated borrowing money for this would just be wrong. Ms. Kasper asked if someone is doing an analysis of whether or not this is going to be a continuing drain and that the expense payout is going to exceed the pay-in for the rest of 2012. Mr. Bauer stated that in answer to the question Willis has done an analysis and our biggest general problem is we were running about 13 people with significant hits on the insurance fund and the past year we have run 25 people. Ms. Kasper asked if the thought is that we will continue to have this significant payout of expenses that exceeds our revenue for the next couple of months. Mr. Bauer stated that is possible. Ms. Kasper stated that would suggest that we are going to need to augment this account within two months or maybe next month. Mr. Bauer stated that this month the month of May we are going to be ok. Ms. Kasper stated but there may be a problem with June. Mr. Bauer stated that is correct. Mr. Hintz stated that he had a question and stated that we have these investments that Treasurer, Kathleen Schaffer comes in and talks about or the revenue that the county has and are not getting very

much interest on and further stated that he understands this is for security but when you come to a point like this we need some of that why would you go out and borrow money at a higher rate isn't there a way that we could tap into some of that. Mr. Bauer stated that is what Mr. Silcox is suggesting as well. Ms. Kasper asked Mr. Bauer when he was talking with the auditor did they talk about how much money they would need in June, and when you were thinking about moving funds around in the general fund for example what fund were you thinking about whether or not you could move that to the health trust fund. Mr. Bauer stated that there just isn't anything in the general fund. Ms. Kasper asked Mr. Bauer what he had in mind and he stated that he doesn't have an answer. Mr. Bauer stated that we have a serious situation so we can go to the budget commission. Mr. Bauer asked that if we did a transfer from the budget commission funds such as \$200,000 and we get out of this situation can we transfer funds back and further asked Ms. Kasper if something like that could be done. Ms. Kasper stated that in the special funds such as the computerization fund the legislature wants the county to put money in these funds and also restricts as who has control over these funds so that the county will have money for the equipment. Mr. Silcox further stated that he feels that there is the possibility of using these funds in difficult economic times. Ms. Kasper stated that she would take a look at this. Ms. Kasper summarized by saying that she will be happy to look at how the commissioners can pull money from the special funds to use for the health trust insurance fund where the contingency and miscellaneous funds in the general fund are insufficient and the question about whether we can get an appropriation from the budget commission are we able then to transfer funds back to the budget commission.

Ms. Kasper stated that she had a few housekeeping matters for the board. Ms. Kasper stated that she thought that the vehicle maintenance agreement looked good. Mr. Bauer stated that the clause about the utilization charge was under question. Ms. Kasper stated that the purpose was to tap agencies with separate revenue sources other than the general fund. After detailed discussion and Ms. Kasper explaining the agreement the board agreed to remove the utilization clause in the agreement. Ms. Kasper stated that she saw the email posting the Airport soliciting bids and has no objection to that going on the county website.

OTHER BUSINESS CONT.

Gary Bauer discussed the Firelands Rails to Trails seeks approval for assistance from the Huron County Engineer's office on a culvert project on the future Northcoast Inland Trail between St. Rt. 601 and Medusa Road. The favor of a written reply is requested. Mr. Bauer will speak with the Engineer before approving. Mr. Bauer also discussed the risk sharing report received from CORSA. Further discussion was had in regards to the future rental space for license bureau and title office at the DJFS and where the rental funds will be paid. Ms. Kasper stated that she does not know if a department can keep a revenue stream for rent and is surprised to hear that. Mr. Silcox stated that we need to have an answer.

At 11:52 a.m. Larry J. Silcox moved to adjourn. Joe Hintz seconded the motion. The meeting stood adjourned.
