Ms. Ezawa stated that they work with Huron County Victims Assistance program and they work with victims to help them figure out how to work on transition.

Huron County Commissioner Report

The mission of The Domestic Violence Shelter Inc. is to provide an alternative to living in a violent situation and to offer education and resources necessary for intervention and prevention of violence and to help victims make healthier choices for themselves and their families.

We are committed to providing primary services to residents of both Richland and Huron Counties.

The Shelter has a long standing partnership with Huron County to provide emergency, safe housing and related services to residents of Huron County when they request those services.

We have long struggled with the distance between our program and residents in Huron County but have, in the past few years, intentionally targeted our involvement in this area in order to bring greater awareness to not only the affects of domestic violence but to ensure that residents know how to contact us and to access our services and programs.

The Shelter provides:

24 hour Crisis Hotline

24 hour access to safe housing

Intensive case management services

Children's Case Management

Sexual Assault Advocacy

Outreach

Community Education

In 2011 we provided safe housing for one woman and 5 children for 78 days of care. We identified 26 crisis calls from Huron County. We distributed over 500 informational flyers at Willard Hospital, Willard PD, United Methodist Church, WASA and Huron County Health Dept. and Huron County Fair.

We facilitated 3 presentations to over 240 students in Willard Middle and High School.

We continue to attend the Huron County Inter Agency meetings. For the last 4 years we have partnered with the Huron County Law Director's Office Victim's Services advocates to man an informational booth at the fair. Someone from either our staff or Victim's Services staffs the booth from morning till evening.

We are currently providing ongoing advocacy and support to a Huron County Teen who is a victim of sexual assault.

October is National Domestic Violence Awareness Month. We will have a display in the Huron County Courthouse showcase this month displaying facts about domestic violence.

Huron County is also forming a county wide Domestic Violence Collaboration of which will be active participants of.

The Shelter is grateful to be a partial recipient of the Huron County Marriage License and Divorce fees. We appreciate the support and generosity of the commissioners in the work of The Shelter.
