## **OTHER BUSINESS**

Gary Bauer discussed a situation at DJFS in regards to a business owner. Mr. Bauer stated that this was just an FYI for the board and that the business owner is having a discussion with DJFS Director but Mr. Bauer stated that he will follow up with the director as well.

Larry Silcox also discussed a situation at the DJFS as well which has been solved by DJFS.

Gary Bauer stated that he had met with Tom Jarrett owner of the Northern Antique Mall leasing 22 East Main Street to discuss the problem with the electric bill. Ellen Hintz had called Mr. Bauer 10 days ago and stated that the up town group (economic development, chamber of commerce, Mayor etc.) had walked the uptown and visited the businesses. When they went to the Antique Mall and Mr. Jarrett let them know what he thinks about his electric bill. Mr. Bauer stated that it is a seriously situation. He let them know that he had to get things in a different format or he would have to look for a different place. Mr. Bauer stated that if this happens and he leaves we will have an empty building setting up there and we are paying for the heat and we have no income from the building which would not be good. Mr. Bauer stated that he had a meeting set last week to meet with the group. The meeting was cancelled because of a snow storm. Mr. Bauer stated that he did meet with Mr. Jarrett last Friday and there is a meeting schedule this Thursday at 1:30 p.m. The mayor suggested to Mr. Jarrett that the county should help him out. Mr. Jarrett stated

that the county has helped him and helped him and that he doesn't want to ask the county for any more help. Mr. Bauer stated that at this meeting he fully plans to say (if the mayor is in attendance) the county has helped him and helped now what is Norwalk going to do to keep this business in town. Now to the specific problem of the heat. Last summer when his bills were out of control with the air-conditioning a meeting was held with the maintenance staff and they changed the configuration of how the airconditioners ran and that was going to help. After we lost our HVAC employee no changed the air filters which caused a problem as well. Now Ohio Edison, Gary Mortis says that there is nothing that they can do for him. Apparently they changed the meter base and Mr. Jarrett is convinced that they should have told the county that they changed it which they did not as far as we now and he is convinced that is part of his problem. Mr. Bauer stated that the bottom line is that his electric heat was \$1,400 one month and \$1,600 last month and he can not survive at that. Mr. Bauer stated that when we did the energy project at the courthouse we ran three outlets for heat over there that would kick on when the outside temperature drops below 30 degrees. Mr. Bauer stated that Mr. Jarrett is suggesting that there be a gas unit purchased that you would hang from the ceiling that would produce heat that would help them keep the electric bill down. Mr. Jarrett would pay for the gas. Mr. Welch stated that you can lower his cost also by giving him more heat from the boilers. Mr. Welch stated that you can lower his costs by giving him more heat from the boilers. Mr. Silcox stated we should give him for heat this way for the interim and stated that he is not opposed to paying for the heater if he pays for the gas but in the interim turn up the boilers. The board agreed to advise Mr. Jarrett that we will look at other systems. It was also discussed that another solution would be to build a wall behind the windows but Mr. Jarrett does not want this to happen. This would be the tremendous way to say on the heating bill.

Pete Welch is not ready to award bids yet for the transfer station improvement project and still needs to talk with Daivia Kasper, Assistant Prosecutor in this regard.

Cheryl Nolan referred to an email sent by Carl Essex in regards to the old scale at the transfer station. The Highway Department would like this scale.

The Engineer's Office is interested in acquiring the soon to be removed scale from the Transfer Station.

We do not need to explain how expensive "new" scales are.

Under these tight budget times the acquisition of the "old" scale, we believe, would provide a cost effective alternative for the acquisition of a scale for our operations.

It would be our intention to completely re-hab the old scale as time and manpower is available. Once operable, the scale would be put back into use for Highway Department operations. Using existing equipment, we have the capabilities to extract the old scale and provide for its transport to our Norwalk facility where

our crew's metal fabrication, welding and mechanical abilities make the consideration of this project possible.

As we are uncertain of the Board's schedule for the purchase, extraction of the old scale and the and installation of the Transfer Station's "new" scale, we'd appreciate the opportunity to discuss the fine points of this matter further should the Board look kindly upon this request.

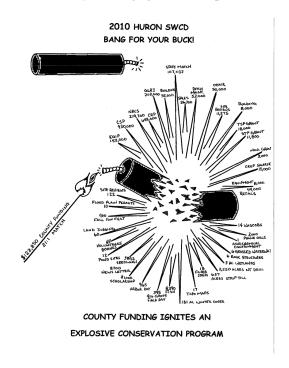

Gary Bauer discussed the courthouse project and stated that he said what he said at the previous meeting and Mr. Seitz wrote what he said but he took it out of context. Mr. Bauer stated that what he said is that there are more ideas out there and we need to find people that have more ideas. We could give it to the University of Toledo, University of Purdue, Ohio State, Ohio Northern engineering classes and they come up with all kinds of ideas. Mr. Bauer also stated that he had spoken about Mr. Frederick's brother being an engineer/architect in Toledo and that he had worked with him on a \$400,000 restroom project at Firelands Campus and stated that he might have some ideas, but it came out in the paper that he needed to talk to Dean Frederick and this was not reported accurately. Mr. Bauer stated that he went to see Mr. Frederick and stated that we need to have more ideas that this idea is just not going to fly. Mr. Frederick and Mr. Bauer discussed different options. Mr. Bauer stated that he is opposed to going through the Recorder's office but Mr. Frederick came up with an idea to go in between the HCOB and the Courthouse and

explained how this would work.

At 10:18 a.m. Cary Brickner, Soil and Water Conservation District came before the board with board members Gerald Martin, Don Sweeting, and Dan Stevens in regards to funding. Mr. Brickner stated that he would like to make a few announcements and discussed that in 2010 the Great Lakes National Program Office Great Lakes Restoration Initiative through the US.E.P.A awarded the Huron S.W.C.D. an \$812,000.00 grant for the North Central Ohio Sediment Reduction Project. Mr. Brickner reviewed the 2010 Annual Report with the board and discussed the 2010 Huron SWCD "Bang for Your Buck" which states county funding ignites an explosive conservation program.



Mr. Brickner stated that he is hoping for the 75% match which would mean \$166,000 from the county.

Dear Larry, Gary and Joe

The Huron Soil and Water Conservation Districts Board and I appreciate this opportunity to showcase the value of adequately funding the Huron SWCD, and the amount of Local, State and Federal funding leveraged as a result.

Please see the attached illustration titled "Bang for your Buck" that shows a very diverse series of programs and funding mechanisms to illustrate a **20:1 match** for every dollar received from Huron County!!

We have submitted budget proposals for getting our 4 full time employees back to 80 hours per pay period with state match scenarios of a low of 52%, medium state match of 75% and a maximum state match of 1:1 or 100%. As a result our need and request of county funding ranges from \$166,000 which would figure a low state match of 52% to as low as \$126,000 if we would get a 1:1 or 100% state match.

As of right now and being a State election year we do not expect to know our next state match rate until April or May of 2011, which is later than when the county budget will be passed. Our Board of Supervisors and I are requesting if at all possible funding the \$166,000 initially with a partial budget payment to get us by until the state match in determined. Once that happens, our final county budget payment would only be what is needed to make the \$299,320 which may be as little as \$126,000 from the County. Please notice that we are using 5 other sources of income to add \$47,000 to our County and State appropriations.

Another dilemma we are facing is the timing of our state match payments. We used to get our full state match amount in the year we needed it. Since the state match funding has moved away from the General Revenue Fund to fees, we are now getting about 40% of our state funding on a monthly basis from January to June in the following year since the state fiscal year runs from July – July. This in a sense equates to a state match **cut of \$43,129!!** 

We know it's going to be another tight budget year, but the Board and I wanted to make you aware of how funding Huron SWCD is a good investment in our County, our Economy and our Environment!!

Mr. Brickner stated that he is asking for the \$166,000 from the county. Mr. Bauer informed Mr. Brickner that Huron County has received a proposal from Erie County to do Huron County planning. Mr. Brickner and the Soil and Water Board members in attendance did not speak favorably to such a proposal.

<u>At 11:18 a.m.</u> Pete Welch came before the board in regards to the Gerken Center B&G request. Mr. Welch stated that there is an agreement that anything that is in regards to appliances it is the responsibility of the Gerken Center to pay for.

The board agreed to deny this request.

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Mr. Welch also presented the terms for the SWMD plan.

TERM	IS:	
1.	Upon approval of the SWMD Plan Update, the SWMD would provide a recycling grant to the city for a sum of \$10,000 annually for five years.	
2.	The SWMD offered to pay for the city's spring and fall trash collection, not to exceed \$25,000 in disposal costs. The city's apring and fall trash pick-up disposal cost for 2009 was approximately \$22,500. Upon the offering, you were not in favor of this term but would consider a \$25,000 disposal rate and charges waiver for each year until the next plant update (five years).	
3.	As in past practices, the county would not charge the city for the loading and transportation of co-mingled recyclable material that are delivered to the transfer station by the city. The third party processing costs would still be passed on to the city.	
4.	Within three years, the SWMD and city would fund a comprehensive study of the county's solid waste disposal management, recycling programs, etc., and the city's waste collection services. The intent is to slow third party review of the systems in-place to reduce operating costs and/or eliminate or privatize either service.	
5.	The city would approve the SWMD Plan Update.	
6.	The county would "pay off" the 20-year bonds for the transfer station in 10-years.	

At 11:25 a.m. the board recessed.

At 11:40 a.m. the board resumed regular session.

Mr. Bauer discussed returning from a township meeting and was at the railroad crossing at Boughtenville and the gates were down and there was no train. Mr. Bauer stated that he called Jason Roblin, EMA to report this. Mr. Bauer discussed Sunrise Cooperative Inc. in regards to the economic impact.

Mr. Hintz discussed the cooling and heating units and how they would be installed at the HCOB.

Larry Silcox discussed the upcoming district luncheons and the first one being February 15, 2011 at 12:00 noon. Mr. Bauer stated that he had attended the one last year and felt that it was productive. It is a good opportunity to hear what is going on in the neighboring counties. The board discussed rotating members attending these meetings. Mr. Silcox stated that Mr. Hintz could attend if he would like to attend this meeting. Mr. Hintz stated that he would prefer that one other commissioner attend with him. Mr. Silcox stated that he would attend also.

Dates of upcoming events were discussed. Mr. Silcox stated that there is a tour of the Glenn Research on March 1, 2011 at 1:30 a.m. Mr. Silcox stated that he is going to try to make that as well. Mr. Silcox stated

that he is going to share the ad for public comments that will be posted in the newspaper in regards to the raceway using the airport runway with Ellen Hintz at the NEDC. Mr. Silcox also discussed a notice that they received from the Ohio Council of County Officials of a Wednesday, March 6, 2011 12:00 noon luncheon at the rotunda in Columbus. Mr. Silcox asked if they were interested in attending. Mr. Bauer stated going back to the email in regards to the airport runway stated that he could easily get that email to the Erie County Visitor's Bureau. The board agreed that he should do so.

Mr. Silcox also discussed a letter received from Michael R. Thomas requesting a county flag. The letter stated that he had traveled Ohio and photographed all 88 Bicentennial Barns and stated that he wanted to collect a flag from each of the 88 counties. The board agreed that if we had a couple of dozen we may be able but if there were only one or two probably not.

Budget Work Session.

The Auditor's budget was discussed along with the carryover. Mr. Bauer reviewed departments that were requesting additional funding. Development Council, Soil and Water Conservation District, the Auditor's office which is the \$15,000 that Mr. Bauer and Mr. Silcox told the Auditor that it was their intent all along that he should have which is a given. The sheriff, OSU Extension and stated that he has Mary Beth Taylor but is not locked in to that. Discussion in this regard was had. The County used to give her around \$2,000 as she operates on a shoe string to take care of wild animals. The county her back to \$1,000 or \$500 and then it was cut back to zero. Mr. Bauer stated that he put it back on for discussion. Mr. Silcox stated that he would not be opposed to giving her \$500 if it is possible but wants to look at the other numbers first. Mr. Bauer explained to Mr. Hintz that it was both his and Mr. Silcox's intent at the last interim budget session that this \$15,000 be put in to the Auditor's budget as request and for whatever misunderstanding that there was it was not included in the interim budget. This \$15,000 needs to be taken care of in this final budget. Mr. Bauer referred to the formula for Development Council and stated that they fall away from that amount. Development Council has asked for some of the \$5,000 that they are down to be restored. Mr. Bauer stated that he penciled in \$3,000 for a starting talking point. The money that is put in the Auditor's budget will need to be put back in contingencies from the carryover figure. Mr. Bauer explained SCORE to Mr. Hintz. SCORE is also funded \$1,000.00 along with HCDC. HCDC will be increased by \$3,575; increase OSU Extension by \$14,900; increase Soil and Water Conservation District \$44,000; Public Defender by \$21,547; Airport no increase. Ms. Nolan explained that the board will have another \$15,000 from the Clerk of Courts title fund for the general fund. Mr. Silcox stated that the Public Defender stated that \$25,122.00 would allow the public defender's office to be open 5 days per week and eliminate the need for the five case file. Mr. Bauer stated that would be \$25,122.00. After further discussion the board agreed to \$21,547.00 increase. The board agreed not to increase the Agriculture Society budget at this time but maybe helping them with projects later. Mr. Bauer stated that in regards to the sheriff. Detailed discussion was had in regards to the sheriff's budget including cruisers. The sheriff got \$115,000 from 9-1-1 last year but could not convince them to give him more this year. By receiving this money from 9-1-1 he hired more people.

Cheryl Nolan asked about any type of raise for 2011 for the non union employees. Mr. Silcox stated we need to know 2% increase non union employees from general fund for 9 months. The board also discussed the health insurance and asked that figures for 1 2 3 4 percent increase on health insurance plan be figured as well. Ms. Nolan will plug in numbers on the budget sheet that were discussed today.

At 1:24 p.m. Gary W. Bauer moved to adjourn. Joe Hintz seconded the motion. The meeting stood adjourned.
