At 9:30 a.m. Public Comment

Sheriff Howard came before the board in regards to his budget appropriations and stated that the individuals in attendance here today are here on their own time and that there are four individuals here that are here on behalf of the command staff at the Huron County Sheriff's Office that he had asked to attend with him to ask questions in regards to the budget that was provided to them. We are here to provide the opportunity to discuss the impacts on the cuts before they are made. The proposed cuts that have been given will have a drastic end. There will be 14 layoffs and will loose 15 if you stay with your policy of not paying for Bob McLaughlin's retirement. This will be 15 people on top of the people that we lost in 2009. We will loose the vast majority of our road patrol and our entire dispatch core and it will have a direct impact on the amount of prisoners that we have in the jail which will then impact the courts. The sheriff stated that the issue that he has is that he would have liked to have the opportunity to sit down and discuss with you gentlemen what these cuts would have meant. The sheriff also stated that by doing some more research and checking with the county auditor they do not feel that these cuts are necessary. The do not appear to be necessary at all. There is \$240,000.00 in contingencies, and the extra money in the insurance fund and along with other monies in the undivided local government fund with has \$374,000.00 so it does appear that there is a significant amount of money available to properly fund the sheriff's department. The sheriff stated that Mr. Silcox made a statement in the newspaper that the county hadn't suffered any layoffs in the budget cut but the sheriff's department had four layoffs and he does not want that fact to be missed. Mr. Bauer made a comment that the board stayed with the 2010 numbers, but the one cut is almost \$100,000.00 less than the 2010 numbers. The sheriff stated that he did not know if there had been a mistake or misinformation or what but he wants to step forward and stated how concerned he is for the safety and welfare of the citizens of this county. The sheriff stated that he has had many contacts with the local farmers and people in the townships who are pretty upset about the fact that we get an 8.6% cut and there are other entities that got a 5% cut and others get a raise. Your cuts will have an impact and on a more of a personal level for some of the men and women that work for him are here today. They are not here because I requested them to come they asked if they could come. This is a good opportunity to look around the room and see that these cuts will have an impact on these people, Huron County's war veteran and dedicated hero to this county and to this nation in Todd Corbin and people like Ted Patrick who has worked and served this county for 25 years they have dedicated and scarified a great deal over the last several years with these cuts. People like the young guys in the back they all have faces not just numbers so when you guys make these arbitrary cuts they are going to have an impact on the safety of my men and women and more important they are going to have an impact on the safety of the people that we are here to serve. We are the only police protection 24 hours a day, 7 days a week 365 days a year for the people that live in the townships and we serve all these citizens through other aspects, through the county jail and also through the civil service. The only thing that he is asking to board to do is to first of all to communicate with them and also to take a second look at these cuts that are not fair and they seem to be reckless in regard. Mr. Bauer stated that his first question is in regards to the safety to the county if there was a hold up in the gas station in Greenwich at this moment could you cover it? The sheriff stated that these are not people on duty and that he has already stated that fact. He has 4 command staff members here that are on duty and they are here for the purpose of the budget and the rest of these people are here on their own time. They were not asked by the sheriff to come in here today. We have people out there on duty but keep in mind we are 12 people short. The sheriff stated not confuse the issue here he is here for the purpose of the overall budget to operate and administer the sheriff's office. Larry Silcox stated that when we passed out the preliminary budget numbers last week and he stated that he had not had a conversation with him personally but he understands that at least one of the other commissioners had said in these preliminary budget numbers don't get too upset. Mr. Silcox stated that you are here today accusing us of making arbitrary cuts, and not understanding what we had to look at when we were making that preliminary budget. We have a presentation from our health care provider that states that they are projecting a 30% increase in health care costs for next year. This relates to that \$13,660,000 that the auditor presented to us. Now those cuts have to come from somewhere if that number holds up. What we have done is we have gone back to our health care people and what can we do to reduce those. Mr. Silcox stated that Sandusky County just passed on an eight percent increase to their health care costs to their employees and we do not

want to do that especially when most but not all have not received a raise in several years, while some of these people under contract have. Mr. Silcox also stated why the preliminary budget is where it is. We have since found out in talking with the auditor and we are aware of the \$300,000.00 plus that is out there in local government funds because the auditor came in here earlier this year and talked to us about it. We are about to put a resolution on to get another \$100,000.00 from him that he has been holding on to in his license bureau fund that was above his expenses. We want to put that money into the budget, we are finding out that we may be able to reduce that large amount in health care that comes from the general fund to about \$400,000.00 and we talked to the auditor since he gave us the budget projects for next year and that if everything goes as projected he is looking at another \$500,000.00 in the final budget. We want everyone here to understand that this is a preliminary budget and we are very hopeful that some of those cuts can be restored. Now can we give you everything that you ask for in next year's budget probably not but we can certainly look at restoring some of those cuts. Mr. Bauer stated that the number that the budget commission gives the board is the number that we deal with. The \$300,000.00 of local government funds the budget commission has to approve and the board can not touch that. Mr. Bauer stated that he wants that to be clear to everyone that is money that we do not have excess to unless the budget commission gives us excess. The sheriff stated that he understands that but he called at least two commissioners when they got their budget and there is no communication. Mr. Bauer stated that he had talked with the sheriff. The sheriff stated that he did not get any response though and stated that they took a huge cut in 2009 and we are a 24 hours, 365 day operation and just wanted to remind the board of that and wants to board to understand what these cuts are going to mean and that he does not have any extra funding out there, and these cuts mean jobs, and the ability to serve and this is the intention of coming here today. Mr. Bauer stated that it is good that they came in today. Capt. Ted Patrick spoke in regards to the budget even if it is an interim budget, and further stated that he does the scheduling for most of the roadside staff and we have guys that have to trade shifts constantly just so that we can keep two people out there. We are also concerned with this budget if something isn't taken care of right away we are going to have to start laying people off. If this is any indication as the cars went because for a year and a half we were trying to get cars out on the road and we ended up with losing the ability to get the bids the cars were gone for the Ford Crown Vics and we ended up with the Dodges and none of the equipment from the other cars fit these cars, so the point is this is something that needs to be taken a look at really quickly because we don't have time as we are going to have to lay people off we don't have a year and a half as it took with the cars. Capt. Patrick stated that a lot has changed since Mr. Silcox wore the uniform, crime is up and stated that the have 132 bed facility vs. a 16 bed facility, we have a terrible fraud problem in this county, a terrible heroin problem in this county, crime is up we have over 6,000 complaints a year and we did it all with 14 more staff members on the road than what we have now and since 2009 we lost these people. Mr. Silcox stated that he understands that but we have to operate this county and there are other things that are mandated that we fund that we can't not fund. So when you look at all the departments they are in the same situation and know that not all departments run 24-7 like you do etc. Mr. Silcox stated but as he looks around at what has happened to other sheriff's departments across the state, such as Williams County, and they have gone from 19 road officers to 8 in that county, Morrow County is in the same situation and Huron County is not as bad as some of the other counties and that is because we have been able to do and will continue to do as funds are available but we all have to understand that money is tight and it is going to continue to be tight in this economy. We have lost 50% of our local government funds from the state in a two year period which is over \$400,000.00 and if we had that money we would not be sitting here talking like this today. These cuts are deep and we are all going to have to make due with less. Mr. Silcox stated that he knows what you people do as he did it as well and he appreciates it but also he has to do what is in the best interest for this whole county and we will work this budget out and we will do what we can, we hear you very clearly today and we will do what we can to restore some of that funding so that we can move forward and protect the citizens of this county in the best way that we can. Sgt. Todd Corbin made a statement that the proposed cuts to the sheriff's budget is going to have greater risk as well as the sheriff's office staff. Sgt. Corbin stated that a comment earlier that some people have had a raise at the sheriff's office and stated that they have not had a raise since 2008. Mr. Silcox stated that they should look at their contract. Sgt. Corbin restated that they have not had a raise since 2008 and the other side of this is that they are down 14 to 15 deputies and if you make these cuts it will put the sheriff's deputies at a greater risk as well as you know Mr. Silcox Huron County is 500 square miles with 60 thousand residents with two deputies cover that area. How can you justify these cuts when we work 2/3 more than everyone else and his other question is how can you justify giving none safety forces more money in the budget than you do safety forces and where is the priority for the citizens for Huron County as we are the ones that provide that safety for them. When you make those cuts the sheriff has to shut down half the jail, or 40% of the jail and you have to put those criminals back on the street and if we are not there to protect them who is? These are things that we want to put out to you because there are a lot of people here that rely on us to answer that

call. Sgt. Corbin also stated that he is a veteran and he is very aware of the danger that they face everyday and it is very hard to be out there by himself or with another deputy that takes 15 or 20 minutes to respond. We do not have the man power to support what you are trying to do and we have given hand over fist to try to help the county manage their budget and they are the ones that are going to end up paying for it along with the county residents. You are putting them at risk and that is his biggest concern. Sgt. Chris Stanfield spoke in regards to the jail side of the budget and discussed the numbers and stated that the are looking at laying off 7 CO's and the guys in the back row here will not have a job and further stated that they have sacrificed and sacrificed every year for the last three years if not more, these guys here on the floor alone with over 100 inmates and do you guys think that is safe, he doesn't. This is what they are forced to do to keep a job and someone is going to get hurt very bad. Sgt. Stanfield further discussed Senate Bill 10 in regards to operating the jail. Sgt. Stanfield stated that the sales tax for the jail over the last three years has gone up \$367,000.00 and that should account for something you are getting a jail for half of what it should cost you. Mr. Silcox asked where does the other half come from which the sales tax does cover. Sgt. Stanfield stated from the general fund but it could be twice as much without the ½ percent sales tax. Mr. Silcox stated that he hears everyone and understands that all of you are here because you are concerned, and stated that he is very concerned and promised that they will look at their budget numbers and will do what they can to restore some of those projected cuts but in the end we have to fund every department in this county and we have to do it with the funds that the auditor certifies to us and when he does this if he doesn't include the \$100,000.00 that he is sitting on in license bureau funds and if he doesn't certify that \$340,000.00 that he has in the local government funds then gentlemen you need to be talking to him because we can only use the number that the budget commission certifies to the board. Sharon Ward stated Mr. Silcox the commissioners make out the budget and when they release the money the auditor writes the check you guys hold the purse strings not the auditor, and don't blame him. Questions were asked as to the appropriation for the contingencies fund and the board explained the appropriation.

Administrator/Clerk's Report

Cheryl Nolan presented information in regards to the RFA for the CDBG FY grant for WSOS and also the RFP for the CHIP application for 2012.

<u>At 11:03 a.m.</u> Gary W. Bauer moved to enter into Executive Session ORC 121.22 (G) (4) preparation for, conducting, or reviewing negotiations or bargaining sessions for public employees, concerning employee compensation or other terms and conditions of employment. Joe Hintz seconded the motion. The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

<u>At 11:15 a.m.</u> Gary W. Bauer moved to end Executive Session ORC 121.22 (G) (4). Joe Hintz seconded the motion. The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

Aye – Gary W. Bauer Aye – Joe Hintz Aye –Larry J. Silcox

At 11:16 a.m. the board recessed.

At 11:21 a.m. Regular session resumed.

Discussion was had in regards to the evaluations. The board decided not to do evaluations today but to work on the budget instead.

Larry Silcox referred to a letter received from CORSA commending the county for meeting all the incentives and the board commended Sue Bommer/Loss Prevention Coordinator for a job well done.

Gary Bauer stated that he is open to going up a percent or two but will not do anything that reeks of fifteen percent. Larry Silcox stated that he would agree with that and stated that he was comfortable with 2% but would certainly look at 3% at this time. If we are going to get to fifteen percent than it needs to be a gradual increase and not a big jump at once. Further discussion was had in this regard. The board agreed to have the contribution figured at a 3% increase to the employee for the general fund.

Larry Silcox stated to go with option 1 and a 3% increase in cost to the employees and crunch the numbers. Mr. Bauer referred to a letter received from Allyn Schnellinger in regards to spouse taking their own insurance if they would have that option and also to piggyback with the birthday rule on top of that. Discussion on vehicles for the maintenance staff was had. Mr. Bauer stated that we need to make two decisions today which is the amount of the employee contribution and the plan option. This is what Dennis Stieber needs to give us hard core numbers and stated this is what the health insurance is going to cost the general fund. The board agreed on a 3% increase for the employee share of the health insurance. Mr. Bauer stated so we asked Mr. Stieber to figure on an 11% contribution. Mr. Silcox asked about the options which are three, one to stay the same, and the option 1 and option 2. Mr. Silcox stated that he was looking at Option 1, with a 3% increase and then crunch the numbers and see where we are at. Sue Bommer stated that with Option 1 you would have to increase the gross funding rate by 22.6 percent and asked if the board took this into consideration. Mr. Bauer stated that he was using their numbers and that is in their numbers. Ms. Bommer stated though that with Option 1 you have to increase that funding rating by 22.6 percent. Ms. Bommer stated that if it was figured by 30.1% then you would decrease it by 8.1 percent from gross funding then add 3% to the current contribution. Ms. Bommer stated that this will not work out in all cases because the standard plan is more like 9%. You would have to look at each and increase it by 3%. Mr. Bauer stated that we actually another \$41,000.00 in contingencies because we don't have to keep it there for a second election. Then we can reduce the \$63,000.00 in contingencies to \$27,000.00 for George Ford's retirement payoff. We put \$450,000.00 in the insurance fund and we are hoping that our number will be less than that then we can move that as well. The board agreed to restore the Common Pleas Court and Juvenile Court/Probate Court to their 2012 requests. Mr. Silcox stated that his concerns at this time are the sheriff's budget and the prosecutor's budget. The board at this time talked with Willis in regards to the health insurance. Mr. Bauer stated that when we look at the boxes on the proposal there is the gross funding box the employee contribution box and the Huron County cost box. We need the employee contribution box to now say instead of them paying 8% they will be paying 11% and then the net Huron County would reflect that. The other thing that we want to make doubly sure of is that we think that John sent us on December 14, 2011 an option 1 and option 2 to increase deductibles and increase out of pocket those kinds of things. Mr. Bauer stated that our belief is that option 1 is the same as on the boxes that they brought to a board meeting 3 or 4 weeks ago and we believe option 1 is the same as the second set of boxes that they originally gave us. If this is not accurate then we need to set up a box that would reflect that. Mr. Bauer stated that what we are going to do with your numbers is give them to the county auditor who will make an exact accounting on what it is going to cost us next year at those rates. Mr. Bauer stated that they also included an option 2 but at this point we are not going to deal with that. Mr. Silcox stated once again that once we get these new numbers we need to look long and hard at the sheriff and prosecutor's budgets. At this time we are catching heat for the amount that we have in contingences so for now let's reduce the amount that we have in contingencies and get it into these other budgets and if more comes in for the final budget then put it back in contingences. The board decided to look at putting the sheriff's budgets back to 2011 funding level if possible. Joe Hintz stated that he needed to talk to the board about the maintenance trucks. One is not good but the other one is really bad and the mechanic agrees. One maintenance person stated that he could use a utility van. The board agreed to look for one. Mr. Bauer stated that he is not inclined to do anything until the interim budget is finalized. Mr. Hintz stated that he told Pete Welch to start looking.

At 1:25 p.m. Joe Hintz moved to adjourn. Gary W. Bauer seconded the motion. The meeting stood adjourned.
