

OTHER BUSINESS

Larry Silcox discussed the Dog Warden quotes for 2 trucks. Mr. Silcox stated that he had given us the quotes and that he does have the funds. There is a Ford Ranger super cab 2011 he can get for \$13,795.00 and there is a trade in of \$2,500.00. Also he has a quote for a 2011 Ford Ranger Super Cab 4 wheel drive for \$17,914.00 which makes the total for these two new trucks \$18,209.00 after the trade-ins. Detailed discussion of whether or not to trade the trucks or keep one or both of them in the county fleet one to replace the white truck and the other to be used as a parts chaser for the mechanic along with discussion in regards to placing the trucks on govdeals. Mr. Bauer asked what would be put on govdeals. Mr. Silcox stated that old ones would be plus some other vehicles as well such as the car that juvenile court used and the white truck. The board agreed that the question is whether or not they want to spend the money to keep one or two of the dog warden's trucks or not as it would be a good idea. The decision needs to be made today or the dog warden may loose his quote.

Gary W. Bauer moved to approve the purchase of two 2011 Ford Rangers Super Cabs one four wheel drive and one two wheel drive, trade in the 2005 Ford F 150 and keep the 2001 Dodge Ram for the total approximate amount of \$20,709.00. Joe Hintz seconded the motion. The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

Gary Bauer referred to an email received from Cary Brickner, Soil and Water in regards to the meeting in Delaware County as follows:

Hello all,

We're all set for a short meeting and tour of some subdivisions in Delaware County on Tuesday, July 19, 2011 from 10:00 AM to noon. We will meet at the Soil and Water office located at 557 Sunbury Road, (SR 36 / 37) Delaware Ohio 43015. We'll start with a short discussion at the office with the Delaware Soil and Water staff and County Engineer, then take a tour of one or two subdivisions as time allows. This should be a great opportunity to network and find out what's working and not for them and us. I know in the afternoon the Huron Commissioners will be visiting the Senior Center down there, so they won't be coming right back at noon. Google maps says to figure an hour and 45 minutes so you may want to figure 2 hours with traffic and construction. Thanks and give me a call if you have any questions.

Attending the tour with the commissioners will be staff from Soil and Water along with Joe Kovach, County Engineer, and some of his staff.

Mr. Bauer also stated that we have three employees in the county that are quite sick and it is affecting the health trust fund. We really need to keep on top of this situation. We are fortunate that we have not promised anyone a health insurance holiday this year which is a good thing. We are not desperate at this time as Roland Tkach stated we are still \$700,000 better than we were his first year as a commissioner. Mr. Bauer and Mr. Silcox stated that they have not heard anything from architect Dan Frederick yet in regards to the vestibule project.

Mr. Silcox stated that we have a quote from RJ Beck for a service call to remove the Spectradome camera on the back of the courthouse building and ship the camera to the factory for repair. They will send an estimate for repair after the factory has diagnosed the problem. The cost is for 2 commercial CCTV System Service – Labor at \$85.00 each and 1 commercial shipping cost \$25.00 for a total cost of \$195.00. The board agreed to have the maintenance department look into removing the camera. Mr. Silcox also stated that we have another person interested in the airport board and asked if we want to bring the people in that have applied for the open position and interview them. The board agreed to interview everyone that has submitted a letter. Mr. Silcox stated that he had the file and asked Ms. Nolan to set up interviews.

Mr. Bauer stated that with the help of Cheryl Nolan, Joe Kovach, Gary Gillen the application for the CDBG funding for the handicap parking at the fairgrounds has been submitted.

At 10:17 a.m. the board recessed.

At 10:30 a.m. regular session resumed. Pete Welch came before the board in regards to staff issues at the transfer station. Mr. Welch explained that he will lose two employees out for medical reasons at the transfer station and has no replacements and asked the board to hire a part time person. Mr. Welch stated that he has discussed these positions with West Staff but they really do not have anyone that could fill these positions. Mr. Silcox asked about the person from St. Paul. Mr. Welch stated that he is more of a maintenance person and that you have to go through the process. Mr. Silcox stated to go through the process but also give him a call. Mr. Welch stated that he is talking part time long time. The board agreed to advertise and post the position. Mr. Welch stated that Ray from RJ K Technologies can not make it for the meeting today but will try for Thursday. Mr. Welch stated that the Health Department called him as they have ants and stated that he would ask the board to bring someone in to spray. The board agreed to give approval for the health department to hire a contractor to spray. Mr. Welch also discussed two change orders on the transfer station but stated that he is not ready for signature yet.

Mr. Bauer stated that he had a meeting with Jan Shingledecker and Dr. Dee Zeffiro-Krenisky in regards to the Gerken building. Mr. Silcox stated that if that happens he wants the maintenance all taken care of by them and not the county as there are other options out there that would enable the county to downsize. Mr. Hintz stated that State Representative Terry Boose reminded the board that the local funding is going to get cut but doesn't know at what degree. Mr. Silcox stated that as long as Governor Kasich is in the local government funds are in trouble. Mr. Hintz stated that we need to prepare for this and referred to down sizing.

At 10:37 a.m. Sue Bommer, HR came before the board and discussed a discrepancy on the law librarian as to whose employee this person is. CORSA feels that she is an employee of the county but Daivia Kasper; Assistant Prosecutor does not feel that this is correct. Ms. Bommer stated that she checked the ORC as well and doesn't know where CORSA is coming up with that. Ms. Bommer has emailed CORSA stating that we do not feel this to be the case. Ms. Bommer also stated that we have been expelled from the group workers' compensation which is not good news it means that have been invited to join CCAO's retrospective group plan which means you go in for a year depending on your record of injuries and illnesses and after a full 12 months after the first year you may be eligible for a refund but this means that we are not going to have any up front savings for 2012, and at least part of 2013. It could be a pretty substantial refund depending on how well the group does and how well we do. There are fifteen in this group. Our discount over the past three years has been in the range of \$45,000.00 but last year they had to take \$8,000 because we were not in good shape. We are going to have more money coming out up front. The other thing with the retrospective group is that you can not piggy back that with the discount that we get for being on Safety Council. We are taking a hit which is not unexpected. Bobby Jo told you about this even thought she did not think it would be quite this soon it was CCAO's decision that we could not be in the group anymore. Ms. Bommer stated that it is largely because of the case at the Engineer's Office. Larry Silcox asked if we could get some in writing as to why this has happened. Ms. Bommer stated that we would be getting this in writing and further explained why this happened. Mr. Silcox asked how do we get back in and Ms. Bommer stated by having a good performance and establishing a transitional work program and salary continuation which the Engineer flatly refuses to do as they say it is not in their contract. Mr. Silcox asked when we will get the letter from CCAO. Ms. Bommer thought that it might be next week. Mr. Silcox stated that once we get the letter it would be his suggestion because we have some issues and if it is a fact that there is a problem with the engineer's office not doing things suggested then we bring the engineer in and we sit down and discuss it with him and if it is clearly a problem with something that happened in his office then we ask him to pay the difference. Ms. Bommer stated that we

need to do the charge back as we need to make the departments accountable for safety record. The sheriff needs to attend one meeting a year that sheriff's are supposed to go so we can get part of our discount with CORSA. Mr. Silcox stated then we need to ask the sheriff to come in and say if this isn't done then it will come out of his budget. Ms. Bommer stated that we need to give 60 day notice to start charging back. Mr. Silcox stated than give the notice with the way the budget is now we have no choice. Ms. Bommer stated that she is telling them this as a budget issues as this could be \$40,000 hit to the budget. The board agreed that this needs to be done. Ms. Bommer explained what needs to be done to join the retrospective group such as we need to make transitional work available countywide, we are supposed to do charge backs, written safety policies and need to have a loss prevention and workers' compensation coordinator. After further discussion Mr. Silcox asked Ms. Bommer to put together what the sheriff needs to do and make it pretty specific and then what the Engineer hasn't done so that we have something when they come in to look at. We need something in front of us when they come in.

At 10:56 a.m. Joe Hintz moved to enter into Executive Session ORC 121.22 (G) (3) a conference with an attorney for the public body concerning disputes involving the public body that are the subject of pending or imminent court action; ORC 121.22 (G) (4) preparation for, conducting, or reviewing negotiations or bargaining sessions for public employees, concerning employee compensation or other terms and conditions of employment. Gary W. Bauer seconded the motion. The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:
