OTHER BUSINESS

Gary Bauer reported on the Family and Children First Council meeting. Jennifer Grant resigned and June Genter has been hired to replace Ms. Grant. Mr. Bauer stated that General Health District has raised the funds to do a survey of the general health of Huron County and explained the process. Mr. Bauer also discussed a flyer that he had received in regards to the Bellevue Community Days and stated that there would be a parade on Saturday, June 25, 2011 at 4:30 p.m. The board agreed to register for the parade. Further discussion was had in regards to the Huron County Courthouse vestibule and Mr. Bauer will discuss the situation with architect, Dan Frederick today. Joe Hintz stated that they had a good meeting last night at the Safety Task Force meeting and feels something will be worked out for the cyclist that complained about the rumble strips. Mr. Silcox reminded the board that they need to look at the overall safety of the residents. Mr. Bauer also reported on the oil and gas meeting that was held last night as well. Mr. Silcox stated that the catastrophic leave committee met and approved leave for Connie Ott. Mr. Silcox stated that he attended the Huron County Airport meeting and made some quick notes in regards to this meeting. Mr. Silcox stated that the fuel sales are up a little bit due to the crop dusting. Discussion was had in regards to the bond for the appointed treasurer/secretary. They did approve that anyone in that position would have to have a \$50,000 bond. Mr. Silcox stated that Dennis Sokol had stated that he had spoken with the airport's insurance company that holds the liability for the airport and he said it would be difficult if not impossible for Mr. Arnold to get a bond. There was also some discussion in regards to the contract and the language and what should be done and there was some discussion to have a meeting next week and ask Daivia Kasper, Assistant Prosecutor to be there. Mr. Bauer asked Ms. Kasper where we are at as we hear Carl Essex saying that you are not supposed to represent the airport authority and where are you at on this. Ms. Kasper stated that she usually does not take her assignments from Carl Essex and she stated that she believes that the prosecutor's office is the statutory legal counsel for the airport. Mr. Silcox stated that Mr. Essex is reading an old attorney general's opinion that says that the prosecutor can not represent a regional airport authority. Mr. Bauer stated now if we were having a problem with them then you would represent the county. Ms. Kasper stated that what they do not represent is if we have a composite political subdivision. If there are counties or multiple counties or if there are counties and cities those group bodies that maybe was that regional airport and we do not represent them. Mr. Silcox stated that is exactly what that attorney general's opinion was addressing it was a multiple county jurisdiction. Mr. Hintz stated that the fuel sales are up and asked if it could assumed that the airport made some money on those fuel sales.

Mr. Silcox stated that according to his figures indicate that all of the fuel sales that they had they made about \$983.50. Mr. Hintz stated that is a good thing but the board agreed that was not much. The airport feels that they make about \$.14 per gallon. Further discussion was had in regards to fuel sales prices and hangar rental fees. Mr. Silcox also stated that he will attend the records retention meeting on June 21, 2011 at 3:00 p.m.

Mr. Silcox stated that his recommendation would be to make a decision on the vestibule and the rest of the permanent improvement projects could be paid for from the remaining bond money, plus the other piece that we need is the final state budget so we know where we are going to be with local government funds. Mr. Bauer stated that it isn't going to make a whole lot of difference that it is going to be around 12 1/2% which is a half of year which will be around 12 or 12 ½ percent loss in our budget for 2011. In 2012 it will be another 12 ½ percent plus another 25% so it will be about 37 ½ % for the 2012 budget. So we were looking at \$800,000 what it was so this year we will be looking at \$100,000 and next year will be looking at \$400,000.00 which is significant and this is part of the \$880,000 that we need to plan for not having next year. Mr. Silcox stated to remember that there is some in that fund. Mr. Bauer stated that when it all settles out what the state gives all of our people back door the loss will be as much as the local government funds and the board agreed that it will be a double hit. Mr. Silcox stated that we have already seen that in Juvenile Court as they lost around \$100,000 and he made up \$50,000 and we had to go \$52,000.00. Judge Conway lost more than the \$7,000.00 extra that he asked for in the budget. Judge Conway stated that he has been using special funds for his magistrate and that will be gone and will have to come out of his budget next year so that is another hit that we are going to have to take plus the hit at the Veterans Services for the half million. Mr. Silcox stated that with what we have already committed we need to hold off on anything more until we figure out what we are going to do with the vestibule and what the final state budget looks like. Mr. Bauer stated that as he looks at the numbers and the bills are adding up on permanent improvements and we have 6 ½ months to go and we just don't know what is out there that can happen. Mr. Silcox agreed and also pointed out that some of that money in permanent improvements will have to be returned. Mr. Bauer stated that we need to have in our minds what we have committed, or what we said would be good etc. We need to know that we can't keep doing this the rest of the year and that we need to be very selective.

At 10:12 a.m. Gary W. Bauer moved to enter into Executive Session ORC 121.22 (G) (3) a conference with an attorney for the public body concerning disputes involving the public body that are the subject of pending or imminent court action. Joe Hintz seconded the motion. The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:
