Sharon Locke, Director stated that the election went well and they will not need additional money this year, however as you may already know there will be two primaries and a general election next year which are all countywide elections. The first primary in March will be for county candidates, U. S. Senate candidates and Ohio House of Representatives and Ohio Senate. The June primary will be for delegates and alternate delegates to the national convention of a political party and member of the U.S. House of Representatives. The general will be for all and is a presidential election. Unfortunately with having to hold three elections we will need additional money to what we asked for in our budget hearing. Ms. Locke stated that the Secretary of State has stated that the county will be reimbursed for the June primary but it will have to be paid up front by the county and we are not sure if it will be a full reimbursement or a percentage. Ms. Locke stated that they will certainly keep the board informed and asked if the board wants to readjust their budget now or play it by ear next year and keep the original figures in the budget and when it gets closer to July or August look at what we need to get through the end of the year. Ms. Locke also spoke about additional space and further explained that they had met with Commissioner Bauer, OSU Extension, and maintenance department but have not heard anything further. Ms. Locke further explained the necessity for this additional space. Mr. Bauer stated that the board has discussed this some and need additional discussion but the first thing that he sees being done is taking out the walls in the back hall which will give them a lot more room. Mr. Bauer stated that if they are in agreement to do that it could be done soon. David Kniffin stated that referendums will be used more in the future and there are a lot of expenses involved with that. Mr. Kniffin spoke in regards to the working relationship with CCAO. Mr. Kniffin stated that the election board is thankful for the working relationship with the board of commissioners. Mr. Kniffin spoke to the building and additional space needs along with how to best utilize the space and their staff. Mr. Kniffin stated that they are anticipating long lines for absentee voting. Mr. Silcox asked what the extra funding would be and Ms. Locke stated that it would be approximately \$40,000 to \$50,000. Tom Gerrity spoke in regards to the telephone system and what they would like to have installed.

<u>At 10:57 a.m.</u> Carol Knapp, HCDC director came before the board in regards to presenting her annual report as follows:

Day One: March 7, 2011 was my first day as Executive Director of the Huron County Development Council. Since I came to the position with over 10-1/2 years training and experience in economic development, I was able to initially dedicate my time to learning as much as possible as quickly as possible about HCDC, Huron County, the communities, the businesses, and the economic development and workforce development organizations in the region.

<u>Community Outreach</u>: I have spent time in each of the cities and villages in the county and have attended council meetings in most of the municipalities with remaining council visits on my schedule. Community outreach and involvement includes attending New London CIC meetings, Willard Area Economic Development Corporation meetings, Celeryville Muck Farmers breakfasts, Willard State of the City, Bellevue Development Corporation Annual Luncheon, Norwalk Economic Development Corporation Annual Luncheon, Willard Car Show, and Norwalk Business Appreciation visits. One-on-one meetings with governmental leaders, community leaders, and businesses also take place on a routine basis. To better serve the southern portion of the county, HCDC maintains an office location in Willard and dedicates at least one day each week to working from that location.

<u>Regional Outreach</u>: County and regional involvement includes North Central Ohio Regional Development Alliance, Ohio Economic Development Association Legislative Day, North East Ohio Ag Breakfast meetings, Team NEO, Jobs Ohio Rollout, Erie Basin R C & D meeting, Ashland Small Manufacturers meeting, Huron County WIA Board meetings, Huron County Township Association meetings, Huron County Project Leadership, EHOVE Workforce Development Advisory Council, Huron County Housing Task Force, Huron County Family Fall Fest, Huron County Fair, and Master Gardeners of Huron County training. One-on-one meetings with economic development professionals in the area also take place whenever needed.

At 11:08 a.m. Karen Fries, Recorder, came before the board to discuss the microfilm scanner which is still working but the problem is that the parts are not available. Ms. Fries presented a letter and quote for another scanner which is rebuilt and is \$10,000.00 and this scanner should be ok to get parts for another seven to eight years. Ms. Fries explained the payment schedule as well. The equipment fund does not have enough money in it to purchase this at this time. Other options were also discussed. Mr. Silcox stated that there had been some discussion as to where document imaging was going in the future and wasn't sure that microfilming was involved in that and asked Ms. Fries if she had any clearer picture of what technology is the best as we move forward. Ms. Fries stated as Ms. Swift had said the other day that technology is moving so fast that we don't know what to be that will hold because they say a lot of times that the CD's life expectancy is five years and then you have to more it into the newer version of technology. Ms. Fries stated that the only thing that has proven to last for years is microfilm. Someday there will be something to take the place of microfilm but it is just a matter of how long it will be able to be viewed. Mr. Silcox asked Ms. Fries what her recommendation is to proceed. Ms. Fries stated that she has researched different options and explained these options and stated that her recommendation would be to purchase the used Cannon for the time being and with that she will have to upgrade some software but that doesn't seem to be a real problem. The one for \$23,000 is good for a five year period and there is no maintenance nothing extra that we have to pay and this would take care of our web page. Right now she is paying \$6,000 just for the web service for indexing. There is no maintenance until after it is paid off and no interest charged. The software can be handled from her equipment fund as an on going project but does not have the funds to purchase the scanner. Mr. Silcox asked if she was talking \$9,700.00 plus the software. Ms. Fries stated yes that she would need \$9,700.00 for just the scanner and the other is the software and that payments of \$5,000.00 per year which would come out of the equipment fund.

This letter is in support of the proposal submitted by Ohio District 5 Area Agency on Aging, (AAA) to Ohio Department of Development for a Housing Assistance Grant for Emergency Home Repair/Handicapped Accessibility Modifications for the 60 plus population in the 9 counties served, (Ashland, Crawford, Huron, Knox, Marion, Morrow, Richland, Seneca and Wyandot).

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A few points that we would like to address in regards to Huron County are as follows:

- 1) Home repair coordination is done through the local senior centers of Senior Enrichment Services in the county. They, in turn, refer clients to the District 5 office and make follow-up calls for the clients, when necessary.
- 2) Many organizations provide specialized services to senior county residents. However, Senior Enrichment Services is the county focal point for senior services and was designated the county organization to provide assistance to the 60+ residents.
- 3) Many seniors residing in the larger homes that were built over 100 years ago cannot afford to repair their homes on an on-going basis, especially living on limited budgets. As expenses continue to rise for everyday living, assistance for repair money increases. With a rising population of elderly citizens, the requests for home repair assistance continue to outweigh the dollars available.

Given the success of past programs we whole heartedly support the grant proposal submitted by District 5 AAA.

IN THE MATTER OF DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS OF HURON COUNTY, OHIO THE QUESTION OF ISSUING BONDS IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$5,500,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING, EQUIPPING, FURNISHING AND OTHERWISE IMPROVING A COUNTY BUILDING TO PROVIDE FACILITIES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS SERVICES:

Joe Hintz moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, there is a necessity of submitting to the electors of Huron County, Ohio the question of issuing bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$5,500,000.00 for the purpose of constructing, equipping, furnishing and otherwise improving a county building to provide facilities for senior citizens services; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Huron, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: It is hereby declared to be necessary to issue general obligation bonds of this County in the aggregate principal amount of \$5,500,000.00 for the purpose of constructing, equipping, furnishing, and otherwise improving a county building to provide facilities for senior citizens services (the "*Bonds*") and to levy a tax outside of the limitation imposed by Section 2 of Article XII of the Ohio Constitution to pay the debt charges on the Bonds and any anticipatory securities. Pursuant to Section 133.18 of the Revised Code, the question of the issuance of the Bonds and the levy of the tax shall be submitted to the electors of this county at an election to be held in the County on March 6, 2012. The approximate date of the Bonds will be July 2012. The maximum number of years over which the principal of the Bonds may be paid is twenty (20), and the Bonds will bear interest at a rate now estimated at 5.00% per year, payable semiannually.

Section 2: The Clerk of this Board is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the County Auditor of Huron County for the certification of the estimated average annual property tax levy, expressed in dollars and cents for each \$100 of tax valuation and in mills for each one dollar of tax valuation, that the County Auditor estimates to be required throughout the stated maturity of the Bonds to pay debt charges on the

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Bonds, assuming that they are all issued in one series bearing interest and maturing in substantially equal principal amounts each year over the maximum number of years over which the principal of the Bonds may be paid, both as stated in Section 1, and that the amount of the tax valuation of this County for the current year remains that same throughout the maturity of the Bonds.

Section 3: This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 4: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.
