So they were going to lose their accrued PTO. Mr. Wilde said we didn't want to penalize them for their years of service because we were changing things. Mr. Brady stated this was something the commissioners wanted to do to try to make them whole until they can start building time with SCAT. We value the employees and appreciate the ones that are willing to come over and drive for the new transportation.

The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

At 9:27 a.m. Pete Welch, Director of Operations and Steve Minor, Buildings & Grounds Supervisor. Mr. Welch stated the architect received a request from a potential bidder to delay the Senior Center bid opening by one to two days due to the Thanksgiving holiday. The board is not in favor of extending the bid date. The bid period has been open for four weeks. Mr. Welch will relay the message to the architect.

At 9:32 a.m. Randy Strickler, Assistant Prosecutor, asked the board to consider funding Victim's Assistance with the opioid money. He had done some research and talked to Ms. Cardone at MHAS. There are two sections in Exhibit A. On the first page under part 1, Community Recovery, there is a subsection, "Early Intervention and Crisis Support". In paragraph five it says "create community-based intervention services for families, youth, and adolescents at risk for addiction including opioids and any cooccurring substance abuse or mental health conditions". Mr. Strickler said a lot of these victims, when they are traumatized, they then self-medicate in order to cope with the trauma. When Victim's Assistance gives out the packets to people, they have a list of agencies that offer counseling. After talking to Ms. Cardone, he believed they are going to beef up these packets to put in some information about coping with trauma. He thought that would dovetail into this. Instead of using general fund money, we have this money for the opioid suit that could be used.

Mr. Strickler continued. Under the next subsection "Address the Needs of Criminal Justice Involved Person", it states "address the needs of persons involved in the criminal justice system who have opioid use disorder and any cooccurring substance use disorders or mental health conditions.". Mr. Strickler stated that most of the perpetrators and many of the victims fall under that category. Mr. Wilde noted Victim's Assistance was Huron County, not just Norwalk. Mr. Strickler agreed, and said he thought he would run it by them to see what they think about it. He offered to prepare a legal opinion that says you can do this. Mr. Wilde asked if MHAS was receiving any opioid funds. Mr. Strickler said no. They don't have any opioid funds, they are telling providers to apply for the funds directly, either through the commissioners or Region 19. The problem is MHAS would just be a pass through. Mr. Wilde said he knew they have asked Victim's Assistance to look to see if there are any other options. He appreciated them looking for other things. We just have to see if it fits. Mr. Strickler again offered to provide a written legal opinion. Mr. Wilde did not think that was a bad idea. Mr. Strickler said there was no real law, it is just going to be according to facts and the language of Exhibit A to the OneOhio Memorandum. Mr. Brady said appreciated him looking for outside sources and talking to Ms. Cardone. They have a high respect for Ms. Cardone and what she does. If she was on board with this he thought they should look at it. Mr. Strickler said he had about a 20-minute discussion with her yesterday afternoon. He had the idea about using the criminal justice category, she brought up the one about creating community-based intervention services for families, youth and adolescents at risk for addiction. Mr. Strickler felt all victims of crime were traumatized, and more likely than not they were going to use some kind of substance to cope with their trauma. Most of the perpetrators are also substance abusers. He thought this was a nice fit and a way to use the opioid money. It is not general fund money, it is money we are getting as a result of the opioid crisis. Mr. Strickler did not want it taken too literally, but the opioid crisis is kind of over. It is now the trauma crisis. The trauma crisis is from the use of drugs, alcohol and/or mental health conditions. Mr. Brady felt there are always lasting effects. Mr. Strickler thought this was a good way to fund the program without using general fund money. Mr. Brady appreciated that they were looking outside the box. He was more inclined to work with them if he knows they made the effort, but weren't successful. He hoped Victim's Assistance would look for more grants, even it requires separating out some time. He knew some of them just don't apply to us because you have to hire a new employee. We are not looking to hire a new employee, we are looking for grants that help us with existing ones. Mr. Strickler said this was just something for them to think about. They were trying to look at another way to fund this, at least until the VOCA Fix Act. They were hoping to get that money in either 2025 or 2026.

Mr. Strickler received the signed lease from Fireland's Local, but it was not notarized. He sent it back to them to have it notarized.

OLD BUSINESS / NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Wilde noted they had a Land Bank meeting next Tuesday at 2:00. Mr. Brady will not be able to attend.

On November 29 the Chamber is having a breakfast. Mr. Boose and Mr. Wilde will be speaking

Mr. Brady wanted to express his appreciation for the meals Mr. Wilde, the Bleiles, and others are going to prepare and deliver to the community for Thanksgiving.

Mr. Brady noted that Winter Conference was only a couple weeks away. Ms. Ziemba suggested they may want to cancel the meeting that is scheduled for Thursday that week. Mr. Brady would also like to cancel the meeting on December 26. Ms. Ziemba has the authority to authorize payments up to \$50,000. Everyone agreed they could be canceled.

Bruce Wilde moved to cancel the board meetings on December 7th and December 26th. Harry Brady seconded the motion.

*Discussion: Mr. Brady explained, for the week between Christmas and New Years', if we have that meeting it starts stacking things up on a very short-staffed office. Mr. Wilde said the big deal for them was always the claims schedule and bills. They need to get that finished up to help figure out what the carryover is going to be.

The roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

Mr. Brady noted the state requires them to have a certain number of meetings each year. They are well in excess of that. Mr. Wilde asked how many were required. Mr. Strickler said 52, one every week.

Mr. Brady asked Ms. Ziemba if there was anything else. Ms. Ziemba said Ms. Crable just brought in an additional resolution for Common Pleas Court. They need to move money in order to cover payroll.
