#### **OTHER BUSINESS**

Gary Bauer reported on the discussion that was had with Steve Euton Norwalk city council member. Mr. Welch stated that Mr. Euton had informed him that a resolution was going to be reviewed at Norwalk City

Council meeting and shared that on council some of their concerns were basically the county's budget numbers. The biggest concern is that if the county lost their debt last year why did the rate only drop \$4.00 based on the city's numbers it should have dropped \$8.00 or \$9.00. Mr. Welch stated that they explained how the general fund had picked up the majority of that \$200,000 or so and the transfer station had \$160,000 and further explained how they came up with the \$4.00 per ton. The city council would like to see something in writing that explained this. Another concern was that they were under the impression that 98% of Mr. Welch's salary comes out of the transfer station, but in reality it is something like 47% comes out of the transfer station. Mr. Bauer stated that the bottom line is that they do have a written figure from Knobe Road at \$25.00 per ton plus the \$9.00 and they are convinced that the can save \$25.00 per every ton that they send out. They explained how the bills still have to be paid even though the landfill is closed and also stated that Norwalk city had a moral obligation as being part of the family county and that the landfill started when Norwalk had problems. Mr. Welch stated that the bottom line to Mr. Euton is that the city has a deal that will save them basically \$100,000 per year and they are looking over 20 years of 2 million dollars. Mr. Welch stated that he does not know if the county can convince the city as to why they need to stay with the county, even though he thinks it is important to try to do so. Mr. Bauer stated that one of the numbers that Mr. Welch needs to use is the portion that was paid out of the general fund and if there had been nothing paid from the general fund then that number could have been reduced even more. Mr. Bauer stated that Mr. Euton would like to have all three commissioners come to one of their council meeting with Pete Welch to answer all the questions. Mr. Bauer feels that at this point the solid waste district plan is not going to be approved by the Norwalk City Council. Mr. Welch stated that the district plan is a minor portion of this. They are not going to approve it because of flow control. Mr. Welch stated that reality of this is that we are going to have flow control Norwalk is going to have to come to our facility whether they like it or not. If they do not approve the plan then the EPA will write the plan and we will live with it. Mr. Silcox stated he would like to have it impressed upon them that if they don't approve the plan what is on the line. Mr. Silcox stated that he is prepared to go back to the committee in regards to the \$10,000 grant being divided up among everyone that is recycling instead of just Norwalk so they loose that, and is also prepared to say they are going to have to start paying for their recycling. Mr. Silcox feels that there is enough support in policy committee to say to these other communities if you want a portion of that \$10,000 lets change it right now in policy. Mr. Silcox feels that it is time the county stops paying for what the city of Norwalk is getting. Mr. Bauer stated that he feels that Mr. Euton feels that the transfer station could be closed with no problems, and feels that if the board goes to meet with the city they need to leave attitudes at home. Mr. Welch stated that he would like to prepare the report that he has stated and hopefully that will answer a lot of Mr. Euton's questions which will take him a couple of weeks to prepare. The 90 ratification process does not start until November 30, 2010. Discussion was had in regards to the proposed ordinance to be considered by council that has incorrect information. Daivia Kasper, Assistant Prosecutor suggested that the board call Mr. Euton and advise that after reviewing the ordinance that some of the dates and amounts seem to be wrong. Mr. Bauer and Mr. Welch will do so.

At 10:23 a.m. Tim Hollinger came before the board in regards to the Erie County WIC renovation project for an expansion of their area. The easiest way for them to make the improvements is for the county to pay for these improvements and WIC pay back in rent payments. At this time they have a HIPPA problem which they are trying to elevate. They would need extra space in the meeting room. Gary Bauer stated that he is very concerned about that. Mr. Bauer stated some examples of groups that need the entire room and usually fill the room. The board agreed to look at the space. They also looked at the cages where board of elections has things stored. Mike Adelman also stated that while Mr. Hollinger is here would like to talk about the second floor where the health department has been remodeling and would like to take a look at the possibility with the HCDC director leaving it might be a possibility for the Health Department to pick up this space at this time while they are remodeling. Mr. Hollinger stated that they are hiring two more people to be able to reach what they need to reach for accreditation. Further discussion was had in this regard of picking up the space where HCDC is now located and relocate Looking for some more space.

#### Assistant Prosecutor's report

Daivia Kasper stated that she is cleaning up the litigation on an old case and would like to have an executive session scheduled for Tuesday November 9, 2010.

Larry Silcox stated that we have \$19,000 in Gov Deals for a vehicle and discussed getting rid of the white van. Mr. Silcox stated that Pete Welch had stated that they only use it on Thursdays for recycling pick ups at the school and stated that he could put a cap on one of the trucks that he has and use it for this purpose.

The only issue is that in the winter time there would be a snow plow on the truck. Mr. Silcox stated that getting rid of the van would open the opportunity for getting two cars one for the mail car and one for around here. Mr. Adelman stated that he feels that is a good idea. The board agreed to put the van on Gov Deals.

Mr. Adelman referred to a letter received from the Mayor in regards to appointing the new zoning inspector to the Planning Commissioner. The board agreed to have resolution making this appointment for the next meeting. Mr. Adelman also discussed a quote received from the Clerk of Courts from Ohio Telecom. Cheryl Nolan will check with Susan Hazel to find out.

Larry Silcox discussed the meetings at NASA Plum Brooke. The board will be attending.

Gary Bauer reported on State Extension Board meeting that he attended and explained that the State Fair Board had been approached in regards to have youth show at the state fair without 4-H, FFA or scouts. Mr. Bauer further explained what is happening in this regards as to why you must have extension involved in this.
