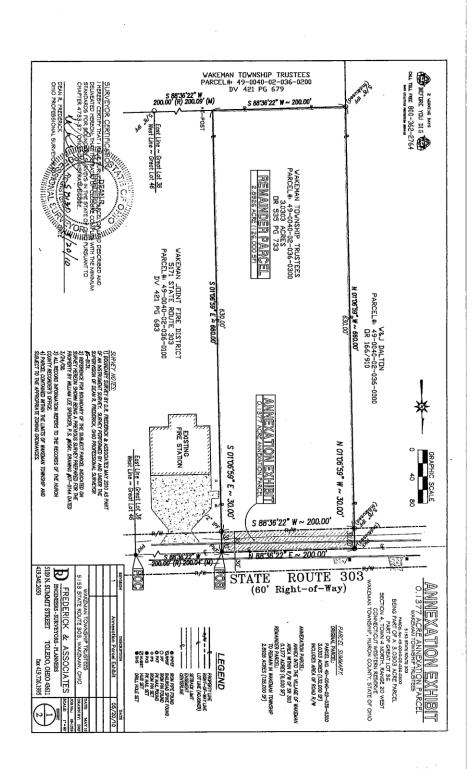

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Ms. Nolan also stated that she and Vickie Ziemba had been asked to serve on the State County Commissioners' & Engineers Administrative Professionals Association board. At 11:26 a.m. Sue Bommer, Human Resources came before the board in regards to receiving an answer to the email that she had sent them. Ms. Bommer stated that in lieu of what the sheriff wants to do we can not get into the program if that happens. Mr. Adelman stated that the sheriff had just spoken about that and he is willing to participate. Mr. Silcox stated that the sheriff's problem is that the same person has been tested the last three times. Mr. Silcox asked if there is anything that can be done with the draw. Mr. Bauer stated that he doesn't want to see anything changed and that the sheriff's department is still has the random drug testing but would like to see something changed if the same person gets called twice and tests clean both times he can skipped. Ms. Bommer stated that what they can do is ask for another draw. The board agreed that is what they would like to see happen. Ms. Bommer stated that the bigger question here is do you want to get in the drug free program and the paperwork will need to be submitted on October 29, 2010 and stated that there is a lot of work to do on this. The board agreed to apply for it and maybe withdraw it later.
