PROMULGATION STATEMENT

Preparedness to cope with the effects of a disaster includes many diverse but interrelated elements, which must be woven into an integrated emergency management system involving all depends on the classification of the control of the classification of the control of the classification of the classification

Disasters necessitate a sudden escalation in the material needs of the community and a reorganization of resources and personnel in order to address emergency response. Many lives can be lost in the confusion and disorganization that accompanies the lack of a full planning effort. Therefore, failure to develop an integrated disaster preparedness plan encourages salvag these activities instead of an effective coordinated operation.

Planning for population protection must be a cooperative effort to avert or minimize the effect of natural, technological, civil, and/or attack related disasters; protect lives and property; and restore the stricken areas to it predisaster status with a minimum of social and economic

This plan is a statement of policy regarding emergency management and assigns tasks and responsibilities to county officials and department heads, specifying their roles during an emergency dissert situation. It is developed pursuant to Section 919.1, boils Revised Code and the Resolution by Huron County Commissioners dated April 21, 1986, assigning emergency responsibilities.
