IN THE MATTER OF ESTABLISHING THE NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM (NSP)

Mike Adelman moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Congress has established the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP);

and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Development (ODOD) has received funds under this program to assist with the current crisis in the housing market; and

WHEREAS, ODOD has decided to provide funds under this program to rural portions of the State via a "regional" approach; and

WHEREAS Huron County is designated to be in Region 4, which has been allocated \$2,376,372; and

WHEREAS, Huron County will, through this "lead agency" submit local projects for funding; and

WHEREAS, the "lead agency" must submit the application for the Region to ODOD by February 27, 2009;

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Huron County Commissioners:

- 1) Huron County agrees to designate Lorain County, and the Lorain County Commissioners, as the "lead agency" for the purpose of applying for, and overseeing, the Region 4 NSP.
- 2) Huron County has designated the city of Willard and the village of New London as Target Areas under the NSP.
- 3) Huron County will submit to Lorain County requests for funding for \$400,000.00.
- 4) The President of the Board of Huron County Commissioners is authorized to sign all documents necessary to apply for these NSP funds, to enter into agreements with Lorain County for these funds, and to carry out the proposed activities under the NSP.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the foregoing resolution was adopted and all actions and deliberations of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Huron, Ohio, relating thereto were conducted in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

IN THE MATTER OF EXPRESSING THE BOARD'S INTENT TO CONDUCT AN INTERNET AUCTION FOR THE SALE OF UNNEEDED, OBSOLETE OR UNFIT COUNTY PERSONAL PROPERTY IN CALENDAR YEAR 2009

Larry J. Silcox moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, House Bill 226 of the 124th General Assembly, effective January 26, 2002, authorizes a Board of County Commissioners to dispose of unneeded, obsolete or unfit personal property through the use of an Internet auction;

WHEREAS, Section 307.12 (E) of the Ohio Revised Code, as amended by H.B. 226, requires a Board of County Commissioners to adopt, during each calendar year, a resolution expressing its intent to sell personal property by Internet auction;

now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Huron County Commissioners hereby expresses its intent to dispose of unneeded, obsolete or unfit personal property by Internet auction during the calendar year 2009; and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that the personal property disposed of through Internet auction may include, as specified in ORC 307.12 (E), motor vehicles acquired for the use of county officers and departments, road machinery, equipment, tools or supplies, any of which is either unneeded, obsolete, or unfit for the use for which it was acquired;

and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Internet auction will be conducted in the following manner under the following general terms and conditions: all items will be sold "as is" with Huron County making no guarantee as to the condition of said items; the purchaser will be responsible for the removal of said items from Huron County property; and, the purchaser will be required to make payment in full within five days following the close of the auction, before any property can be released; and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that the number of days of bidding on the property involved, as specified in ORC 307.12, will be at least fifteen days, including Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays; and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Huron County Board of Commissioners has contracted with GovDeals, Inc., 5913 Carmichael Place, Montgomery, Alabama, 36117, telephone number 800-613-0156, as its representative to conduct the Internet auction on the county's behalf; and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Board will publish in the County's local newspaper, the *Norwalk Reflector*, a summary of the information contained in this resolution on the following dates: February 7, 2009; and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that a notice similar to the one published in the newspaper will be posted continually throughout calendar year 2009 in a conspicuous place in the office of the County Auditor, the offices of the Board of County Commissioners and on the Huron County Internet website; and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Huron County Board of Commissioners reserves the right, at a later date, to establish the minimum prices that may be accepted for any property that is the subject of the Internet auction, the terms and conditions of any particular sale that may occur, including, but not limited to, requirements for pick up and/or delivery of the property, method of payment, and payment of sales tax in accordance with applicable laws;

and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that the information described in the paragraph above will be provided on the Internet at the time of the auction itself, or will be provided before that time, upon request, if the terms and conditions have been determined by the Board of County Commissioners or its representative; and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Huron County Auditor; and further

Larry Silcox stated that he has the list of vehicles that need to be sold on GovDeals. Mr. Silcox also stated that he had the mechanic logs for two weeks.

At 9:45 a.m. Sue Bommer HR came before the board in regards to adjusting the work week and also referred to the local 710 contract as well and also referred to other material and policies in this regard. Ms. Bommer also stated that the lists of non classified employees are coming in and further discussed the opinion of the BWC in regards to the firefighters leaving during their work day to fight a fire and the liability issues. If this is done and the liability comes under the township fire department, a letter will be needed from the firefighter employees that the liability in the case of an accident is that of the township and the county will also need a current BWC certificate from the township on file at all times. Daivia Kasper and Sue Boomer were in conversation with the BWC during the same phone call.

Daivia Kasper had nothing to report to the board. Larry Silcox asked Ms. Kasper to check on late fees and whether or not public entities have to pay the late fees per the Ohio Revised Code.
