WHEREAS, this matter came on for hearing pursuant to Section 709.02 of the Ohio Revised Code upon a petition of the above mentioned property owners to annex property into the Village of Plymouth, Huron County, Ohio;

WHEREAS, upon the evidence presented, the Board of Huron County Commissioners find:

- 1. The petition meets all the requirements set forth in, and was filed in the manner provided in, section 709.02 of the Revised Code.
- 2. The persons who signed the petition are owners of real estate located in the territory proposed to be annexed in the petition, and, as of the time of the petition was filed with the board of county commissioners, the number of valid signatures on the petition constituted a majority of the owners of real estate in that territory.
- 3. The municipal corporation to which the territory is proposed to be annexed has complied with division (D) of section 709.03 of the Revised Code.
- 4. The territory proposed to be annexed is not unreasonably large.
- 5. On balance, the general good of the territory proposed to be annexed will be served, and the benefits to the territory proposed to be annexed and the surrounding area will outweigh the detriments to the territory proposed to be annexed and the surrounding area, if the annexation petition is granted. As used in division (A) (5) of this section, "surrounding area" means the territory within the unincorporated area of any township located one-half mile or less from any of the territory proposed to be annexed.
- 6. No street or highway will be divided or segmented by the boundary line between a township and the municipal corporation as to create a road maintenance problem, or, if a street or highway will be so divided or segmented, the municipal corporation has agreed, as a condition of the annexation, that it will assume the maintenance of that street or highway. For the purposes of this division, "street" or "highway" has the same meaning as in section 4511.01 of the Revised Code.

Ms. Nolan stated that she had received a phone call from Sr. Carroll Schemenauer, SND - Pastoral Leader, Wakeman St. Mary's Church in regards to annexing the church cemetery to the village of Wakeman. Ms. Nolan will send the proper paperwork to St. Carroll for such annexation.

Ms. Nolan also discussed the CDBG project application that Wakeman township trustees submitted for funding of the new restrooms at the Dalton Park. After reviewing with WSOS and the Ohio Department of Development it was found that the project would not qualify for funding as this will be new construction and new construction already needs to be ADA compliant so CDBG funds can not be used for this project. Daivia Kasper, Assistant Prosecutor also spoke to the driveway access problem at the park and ODOT will not grant another access to the park.


OTHER BUSINESS

HURON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

At 10:15 a.m. the board recessed.

At 10:28 a.m. regular session resumed

Mike Adelman discussed the county data exchange in regards to population for 1950 and 2007. May 28 and May 29 breakfast of champions 7:35 a.m. Norwalk Middle School cafeteria.

Larry Silcox reviewed the Spy Glass proposal that was presented last week and the board agreed not to use this program at this time.

Gary Bauer asked when the paving project was brought up and further questioned the proposal as to whether or not there was other proposals and if the project was starting right away. Mr. Adelman stated no that the project was not starting immediately and that they did get other proposals. Mr. Bauer also asked about Mr. Moyer and the mulch and being put back in charge of this project at the next fair board meeting and that he would like to know what the outcome of this is.

At 10:39 a.m. the board recessed.

At 11:00 a.m.

Wade Rakes, Director of Public Liaison Governor Strickland's office came before the board and stated that he is here today to listen to what the county needs are.

Gary Bauer stated that we are pleased to have the stimulus money for the bridge projects and also the funds for Willard. Would like to see more dollars come to Huron County or at least close to what it was across the state. Mr. Bauer also discussed the fact that Huron County is number 1 in unemployment as well. Larry Silcox referred to job creation and tax on industry and Ohio being industry friendly, and also asked that the state take a look at Workers' Compensation. Mr. Rakes stated that BWC system is to protect the injured worker and that comes with a fee.

Mike Adelman thanked Mr. Rakes for attending the commission meeting this morning and also spoke to unemployment and economics across the state and job creation and stated with this in mind it has been his opinion that government can not create jobs but needs to create the environment that would bring jobs to Huron County. Mr. Adelman asked what things do we have that could be made available to Huron County from the state that can help us set that environment to bring jobs to Huron County? What avenues can we go down that will help us create that kind of environment. Mr. Adelman also asked about the recovery act or stimulus funding and a lot of it being directed as to where it can go and where it can be used. This has been indicated through the federal government which is where the money is coming from. Mr. Adelman also discussed the stimulus project for Willard which is the Mercy Hospital project that he had written to the Governor in regards to. Mr. Adelman explained such project to Mr. Rakes. Mr. Adelman stated that this is an opportunity for jobs not just in the health field but you would have 20 to 24 months of construction jobs as well, and would bring additional development. Mr. Rakes stated that there are a few ways and it goes to Mr. Silcox's question as to how do we actively portray the environment here in Ohio and how it has changed in the last half dozen or so years. The Governor asked that his cabinet produce two very important reports early in his administration. You will see education and economic development being of significant priorities in the ten year plan. Mr. Rakes spoke in depth about the stimulus projects.

Mr. Silcox also stated that the runway project in Erie County is also something that Huron County is interested in as well. Mr. Rakes stated that he totally understands the fact that my neighbor's development and growth does not mean that everyone that works there is going to live there and talked about the ripple effect to go across the state. This is why we have regions, why we have regional workforce, why we have regional economics. Mr. Rakes stated that he would call the Washington office to work with the delegation as to what our state priorities are so when we have projects such as this it is important that we are communicating back to you some of the assistance that you may need. Mr. Silcox spoke to NASA's over all plans and to potential development that will be there once this runway is put in it has to be considered an economic bomb for their whole area.

Mr. Bauer spoke to OSU Extension and stated that agriculture is the number 1 industry in Ohio and referred to the state budget being 1/10 of 1% for agriculture for the number 1 industry. Extension has taken a 24% hit over the last four years, they are cutting staff and there 40 more cuts on board that will be made and the governor's budget really hurts them. The House has put some funds back in. They are looking at needing 3.5 million dollars to save extension as it is and they are hoping that the senate will come back and help out some more. Extension deals with more than just agriculture on the farm they also deal with urban residents as well. To say nothing of 4-H. Morrow County passed a levy for extension. Mr. Rakes stated that he speaks clearing that the budget is a reflection of the revenue and that there are a variety of programs that the administration care about and know are good programs but many of those decisions are based entirely on the fact that we are several billion dollars lower than we were just a few years ago and we understand that without the stimulus we would be looking at types of roll backs that would be even worse. Without knowing what the future holds every decision is made in the essential mode.

At 12:43 a.m. Larry Silcox discussed the heating system at DJFS and stated that Tom Adelman will look at the system for \$85.00. The board agreed to do so.

At 12:44 p.m. Larry Silcox moved to adjourn. Mike Adelman seconded the motion. The meeting stood adjourned.
